Regular check-ups every six months let the paediatric dentist monitor your child's dental development, catch issues early, and apply preventive treatments like fluoride varnish and fissure sealants that significantly reduce the risk of tooth decay.

Caring for children with additional needs

One of the most important things specialist paediatric dentists bring to the table is the ability to care for children with autism spectrum disorder, ADHD, intellectual disability, dental phobia, or other conditions that can make dental visits harder. General dentists often don't have the specific training or experience to work effectively with these patients.

At the Tooth Fairy Centre at Core Dental Berwick, the specialist paediatric team adapts their approach for each child's individual needs. Tell-show-do, sensory preparation, graduated desensitisation, and distraction strategies are part of everyday practice. For children who need treatment under general anaesthesia, referral through the Core Dental Group network is available.

Fissure sealants — protecting molars from the start

When a child's first permanent molars come through — typically around age six — the deep grooves on the chewing surfaces are highly vulnerable to decay. Fissure sealants are a simple, pain-free preventive treatment that seals those grooves and dramatically reduces the risk of cavities. It's one of the most effective preventive treatments in children's dentistry and is covered under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule for eligible children.

The Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS)

Shared patient records across the Core Dental Group network

Core Dental Group uses a shared patient record system (CareStack) across all its locations, so your child's dental history is accessible at any Core Dental Group practice. If your family moves, travels, or needs to visit a different location, there's no starting from scratch. Paediatric dentists across the network can see your child's full dental history, treatment notes, and x-rays, keeping care consistent wherever you go.

When your child needs more: referral within the Core Dental Group network

Most children's dental needs can be fully met at Core Dental Berwick. Some children have more complex requirements that benefit from the extended specialist team available through the broader Core Dental Group network, including the Manchester Unity Building specialist centre in Melbourne's CBD.

Core Dental Group refers within its network for:

- Children with severe dental phobia who need sleep dentistry under general anaesthesia with a specialist anaesthetist
- Children with autism, neurodivergence, or significant disabilities who need treatment under general anaesthesia because behavioural management alone isn't enough
- Children with breathing, snoring, or sleep-disordered breathing who need assessment through the TMD and Sleep Clinic and specialist orthodontist
- Children requiring early intervention orthodontics — referral to the specialist orthodontists at the Collins Street Specialist Centre (CSSC) for jaw growth guidance, palatal expansion, and bite correction
- Children with complex facial or jaw development issues needing coordinated care across paediatric dentistry, orthodontics, oral surgery, and diagnostic imaging

Through the Core Dental Group network, paediatric dentists work alongside specialist orthodontists, oral and maxillofacial surgeons, the TMD and Sleep Clinic, orofacial myofunctional therapists, and Collins Street Imaging, which offers in-house CBCT and 3D radiography.
