****Caring for children with additional needs****

One of the most important things specialist paediatric dentists bring to the table is the ability to care for children with autism spectrum disorder, ADHD, intellectual disability, dental phobia, or other conditions that make dental visits genuinely difficult. General dentists often don't have the specific training or day-to-day experience to work effectively with these patients.
