Regular professional cleans work alongside your home routine by removing tartar and bacterial deposits that brushing and flossing simply can't address on their own.

For most patients, a check-up and clean every six months is the right interval. For those with specific risk factors — a history of gum disease, higher decay rates, diabetes, dry mouth, or orthodontic appliances — more frequent visits may make sense.

What does a dental check-up include at Core Dental Group Caroline Springs?

****Comprehensive tooth examination****

Your dentist examines each tooth for decay, cracking, wear, acid erosion, and any changes since your last visit. Intraoral cameras let us show you exactly what we're seeing, which makes the whole process more transparent and easier to follow.

****Gum health assessment****

We measure gum pocket depths, check for bleeding and inflammation, and assess bone support levels. Gum disease is Australia's most widespread chronic condition and a leading cause of tooth loss. Catching it early, at the gingivitis stage, means it can often be reversed. More advanced disease requires longer-term management, which is precisely why regular monitoring makes such a difference.

****Oral cancer screening****

We examine all soft tissue in the mouth — gums, tongue, cheeks, lips, floor and roof — for any signs of abnormal change. Oral cancer found early is far more treatable than oral cancer found at a later stage.

****Assessment of existing restorations****

We check the condition of your existing fillings, crowns, bridges, and other dental work for signs of wear, cracking, or secondary decay. Restorations don't last forever, and identifying those that need attention early is much better than dealing with a failed restoration down the track.

****Dental X-rays****

Taken as needed based on your risk profile and the time since your last set. X-rays let us see between teeth, assess bone levels, check beneath restorations, and evaluate areas that aren't visible during a clinical examination. We use digital X-rays, which produce significantly lower radiation than traditional film X-rays.

****Bite, jaw, and TMJ assessment****

We check for signs of teeth grinding (bruxism), jaw clenching, and temporomandibular joint (TMJ) issues that can lead to tooth wear, cracking, and jaw pain over time.

****Oral hygiene review****

We'll talk through your home care routine — brushing, flossing, interdental cleaning — and offer personalised advice on what would genuinely benefit your specific situation.

What does a professional dental clean involve?

****Tartar removal (scaling)****

Tartar is hardened plaque that adheres firmly to tooth surfaces and under the gumline. It can't be removed with a toothbrush and builds up over time regardless of how carefully you brush. We use ultrasonic scalers and hand instruments to remove it thoroughly from all surfaces.

****Subgingival cleaning****

For patients with signs of gum disease or deeper pockets, we clean below the gumline to remove bacterial deposits, smooth root surfaces, and support gum reattachment. This is one of the most critical parts of gum disease management and prevention.

****Polish and stain removal****

We polish teeth to remove surface stains from coffee, tea, red wine, and other common culprits.

****Fluoride application****

A professional fluoride treatment is applied to strengthen enamel and provide additional protection against decay — particularly valuable for children and patients with a higher cavity risk.

****Oral hygiene instruction****

Personalised guidance on brushing technique, flossing, and interdental cleaning, tailored to what our assessment reveals about your current routine.

CEREC same-day restorations
