****Partial dentures****

Partial dentures replace one or several missing teeth while keeping your remaining natural teeth intact. Each set is custom-made to blend naturally with your smile and comes in three materials:

- Acrylic partial dentures — lightweight and affordable, a practical entry-level choice for patients who want a straightforward solution - Cobalt-chrome metal partial dentures — more durable and well-suited to anyone planning to wear dentures long-term; the metal framework provides superior strength and stability - Flexible resin partial dentures — a good fit for transitional or shorter-term use, offering a comfortable, metal-free alternative

Multiple adjustments are included to get the fit comfortable and stable from the start.

****Full dentures****

Full dentures replace all teeth in the upper or lower jaw. Two options are available depending on your situation:

- Conventional full dentures — placed after the gums have healed following extractions, typically producing the best long-term fit and stability - Immediate dentures — fitted on the same day as extractions, so you're never without teeth while your gums heal; these generally require more adjustment visits as healing progresses

****Implant-retained dentures****

For patients who want the most secure and stable option, implant-retained dentures are anchored directly to dental implants placed in the jawbone. There's no slipping or shifting, and most patients find they can eat, speak, and smile with genuine confidence. Implant-retained dentures also preserve jawbone density — something conventional dentures can't do.

For complex implant-retained denture cases that require specialist prosthodontic input, patients at Core Dental Berwick can be referred to the Collins Street Specialist Centre within the Core Dental Group specialist network.

****What to expect when getting dentures at Core Dental Berwick****

HICAPS on-the-spot claiming is available at Core Dental Berwick for eligible funds, so you pay the gap on the day rather than waiting for reimbursement. Interest-free payment plans are available through Payright. The team can walk you through your options when you book your consultation.

Implant-retained dentures come closest to the experience of natural teeth and generally allow a broader diet more quickly.
