Diagnosis and screening Every comprehensive exam at our Caroline Springs practice includes a detailed periodontal evaluation. Our dentists measure pocket depths around each tooth, check for gum recession, and use digital radiography to assess bone support. Catching gum disease early is the foundation of managing it well, and that screening is built into every check-up we do.

Deep cleaning — scaling and root planing For patients diagnosed with gum disease, we offer scaling and root planing, a specialised deep cleaning procedure. It clears away calculus (hardened plaque) and bacterial toxins from below the gumline and along the root surfaces, leaving a smooth, clean surface that encourages the gums to reattach and helps reduce pocket depth. Depending on how advanced the disease is, treatment may be spread across a few appointments. Local anaesthetic is available to keep you comfortable throughout.

Periodontal maintenance programs Gum disease is a chronic condition, and staying on top of it over time is what prevents relapse. After your initial treatment, our team puts together a personalised maintenance program for you. These visits, typically every three to four months, include thorough professional cleaning, pocket depth checks, and an ongoing assessment of how your gums and bone are holding up. Keeping up with these appointments is the most effective thing you can do for long-term gum health.

Gum grafting referrals When gum recession has progressed to the point where root surfaces are exposed or tooth support is at risk, gum grafting may be the right next step. Core Dental Caroline Springs can arrange referrals to qualified periodontal specialists who perform soft tissue grafting to restore gum coverage, ease sensitivity, and improve the overall appearance of your smile.
