Diagnosis and screening Periodontal health assessment is a standard part of every comprehensive examination at Core Dental Glenferrie. Clinicians measure gum pocket depths around each tooth, check for signs of recession, and use digital imaging to assess bone levels. This systematic screening picks up gum disease at the earliest possible stage, often well before patients notice any symptoms themselves.

Deep cleaning — scaling and root planing For patients diagnosed with periodontal disease, scaling and root planing is the foundation of initial treatment. This deep cleaning procedure removes hardened plaque (calculus) and bacteria from beneath the gumline and along root surfaces. Smoothing the roots creates the right conditions for gums to heal and reattach, reducing pocket depths and stopping disease progression. Treatment is tailored to each patient and may take place over one or more appointments, with local anaesthetic available throughout.
