What is a dental emergency?

A dental emergency is any urgent situation involving the teeth, gums, jaw, or surrounding structures that needs immediate professional attention — to relieve significant pain, stop bleeding, address infection, or save a tooth.

Dental emergencies treated at Core Dental Group Berwick include:

- ****Severe toothache**** — deep, persistent pain that over-the-counter medication can't touch
- ****Knocked-out tooth**** — a tooth completely displaced from its socket following impact, a fall, or an accident
- ****Cracked or fractured tooth**** — particularly fractures that extend into the root or dental pulp

- **Lost or broken dental restorations** — fillings, crowns, bridges, or veneers that have come off or fractured - **Dental abscess** — a bacterial infection causing swelling, throbbing pain, and sometimes fever - **Soft tissue injuries** — lacerations to the gums, lips, tongue, or cheeks - **Broken or displaced orthodontic appliances** — wires or brackets causing injury inside the mouth - **Dental trauma from sport or accident** — Casey-Cardinia is a high-activity community, and dental injuries during sport are common - **Object wedged between teeth** — where home remedies haven't worked

Not sure if your situation counts as a dental emergency? Call us. The team will assess things and point you in the right direction. With dental problems, acting sooner is almost always the better call.

Why timing matters

The outcome of many dental emergencies comes down to how quickly you get professional care.

A knocked-out permanent tooth has the best chance of successful reimplantation within 30 to 60 minutes of the injury. An untreated dental abscess can spread infection to the jaw, neck, or beyond, with potentially serious health consequences. A cracked tooth left without treatment tends to get worse, turning what could have been a straightforward restoration into an extraction. And the day-to-day impact of dental pain on sleep, eating, and general function is very real.

Core Dental Group Berwick makes emergency patients a priority. When you call, the team will triage your situation and get you in as quickly as possible.

Emergency dental services at Core Dental Group Berwick

Pain relief and urgent diagnosis

Relieving pain and getting an accurate diagnosis is always the first step. The clinic uses digital OPG X-rays and intraoral imaging to quickly identify the source and extent of the problem, then walks you through your options and a clear treatment plan.

Toothache treatment

Toothache can come from decay, a cracked tooth, an exposed root, gum disease, or a dental abscess. The team finds the cause and provides the right treatment — whether that's a filling, root canal therapy, antibiotics, or a specialist referral for more complex cases.

Knocked-out tooth

If your tooth has been knocked out, here's what to do on your way to Core Dental Group Berwick:

1. Pick up the tooth by the crown (the white visible part) — never the root
2. If it's dirty, rinse gently with milk or saline — don't scrub
3. Carefully reinsert the tooth into its socket if you can, holding it gently in place
4. If reinsertion isn't possible, store it in milk, saline, or between your cheek and gum
5. Get to the clinic immediately — every minute counts

The team will reimplant and splint the tooth, giving it the best possible chance of long-term survival.

Cracked and fractured teeth

- Minor chips — smoothing and composite resin bonding - Moderate fractures — a dental crown to protect and restore the tooth - Severe fractures — root canal therapy and a crown, or extraction where the tooth can't be saved

Dental abscess

The team will drain the abscess, remove the source of infection through root canal therapy or extraction, and prescribe antibiotics where appropriate. Don't apply heat to a dental abscess, and don't attempt to drain it yourself. Get professional care straight away.

****Lost or broken fillings and crowns****

A lost filling or crown leaves sensitive tooth structure exposed and can cause real discomfort. The emergency team can replace fillings, re-cement a loose crown, or arrange for a new crown where the original can't be reused.

****Soft tissue injuries****

Injuries to the gums, lips, tongue, or cheeks are assessed, cleaned, and sutured where needed. The team makes sure the injury is healing properly before you leave.

****Emergency care for children****

Berwick and the Casey area is home to one of the largest family communities in Melbourne's south-east. Core Dental Group Berwick has plenty of experience managing dental emergencies in children, with a calm approach that helps put kids and parents at ease.

One important note: a knocked-out baby tooth should not be reimplanted. Call the clinic for guidance before taking any action.

Preventing dental emergencies

Many dental emergencies are preventable, or at least less severe, with the right habits in place:

- **Keep up with regular check-ups** — Six-monthly examinations catch problems before they escalate. Routine care is simpler and less costly than emergency treatment. - **Wear a custom mouthguard for sport** — The Casey-Cardinia community is a sporting one. A custom mouthguard from Core Dental Group Berwick offers significantly better protection than anything off the shelf. - **Don't use your teeth as tools** — Opening packaging or biting down on hard objects puts unnecessary stress on your teeth and increases fracture risk. - **Deal with small problems early** — Sensitivity, a minor chip, or a slightly loose filling rarely improves on its own. Book in sooner rather than later. - **Wear a nightguard if you grind** — Bruxism significantly increases the risk of cracks and fractures over time. A custom nightguard protects your teeth while you sleep.

Private health insurance and emergency dental costs

Emergency dental costs vary depending on the treatment required. Core Dental Group Berwick accepts all major private health funds, and the team will work to make the most of your available benefits.

If you have a moment before your appointment, it's worth checking your emergency dental cover with your health fund. Reception is happy to talk through fees and payment options.

For patients without private health insurance, the clinic offers transparent pricing and flexible payment arrangements where possible.

Frequently asked questions

How soon can I be seen at Core Dental Group Berwick for a dental emergency?

The clinic prioritises emergency patients and aims to see urgent cases the same day wherever possible. Call as soon as your emergency occurs and the team will do everything they can to fit you in promptly.

Does Medicare cover emergency dental treatment?

Medicare generally doesn't cover adult emergency dental treatment. Eligible children may be able to access services under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS). Core Dental Group Berwick is registered under the CDBS — speak with the team about your child's eligibility.

Can I access my records from other Core Dental Group clinics?

Yes. Core Dental Group uses CareStack, a shared patient records platform across the group. Your history from any Core Dental Group or Smile Solutions location is accessible at Berwick.

Where will I be referred for specialist care?

To the Collins Street Specialist Centre in Melbourne's CBD, part of the Smile Solutions Group. Your Berwick dentist coordinates the referral and manages your follow-up care.

What if I need care after hours?

Contact the clinic using the details on the website for after-hours emergency guidance.
