What counts as a dental emergency?

A dental emergency is any urgent situation involving the teeth, gums, jaw, or surrounding structures that needs prompt professional attention — to stop pain, control infection, halt bleeding, or save a tooth.

Common dental emergencies seen at Core Dental Group South Melbourne include:

- ****Severe toothache**** — deep, persistent pain that over-the-counter pain relief can't manage - ****Knocked-out tooth**** — a tooth completely displaced from its socket after a fall, collision, or accident - ****Cracked or fractured tooth**** — particularly fractures that reach into the root or pulp - ****Lost or broken fillings, crowns, bridges, or veneers**** — exposed tooth structure causing pain and sensitivity - ****Dental abscess**** — a bacterial infection bringing swelling, fever, and throbbing pain - ****Soft tissue lacerations**** — cuts to the gums, lips, cheeks, or tongue that won't stop bleeding - ****Broken or displaced orthodontic appliances**** — wires or brackets causing injury inside the mouth - ****Dental trauma from impact**** — injuries from sport, accidents, or falls - ****Object wedged between teeth**** — where home remedies haven't worked

Not sure if your situation qualifies? Call the clinic. The team can talk through what's happening and advise on how urgently you need to be seen. In most cases, acting sooner is the right call.

Why timing matters

The sooner you get professional care, the better your chances of a full recovery — and of keeping a damaged or displaced tooth.

A knocked-out permanent tooth has the best chance of successful reimplantation when you reach a dentist within 30 to 60 minutes. An untreated dental abscess can spread infection to the jaw, neck, or beyond. A cracked tooth that goes without treatment tends to worsen over time, often turning something manageable into an extraction. And the knock-on effects of severe dental pain — disrupted sleep, difficulty eating, trouble concentrating — stack up fast.

Core Dental Group South Melbourne triages emergency cases, gets patients in quickly, uses modern imaging to diagnose accurately, and delivers effective treatment to relieve pain and protect your oral health.

Emergency dental services at Core Dental Group South Melbourne

Pain relief and assessment

Relieving pain and getting a clear picture of what's happening comes first. The clinic uses digital OPG (panoramic X-ray) and intraoral imaging to understand the full extent of the issue. From there, the team puts together an immediate treatment plan and walks you through your options in plain terms.

Toothache treatment

Toothache can come from decay, a cracked tooth, an exposed root, gum disease, or a dental abscess. Once the cause is identified, treatment follows — removing decay and placing a filling, root canal therapy, antibiotic prescription, or a specialist referral where that's the appropriate next step.

Emergency management of knocked-out teeth

If you've had a tooth knocked out, here's what to do on your way to the South Melbourne clinic:

1. Pick the tooth up by the crown (the white part) — avoid touching the root
2. Don't scrub or clean the root — if it's dirty, rinse gently with milk or saline
3. Try to reinsert the tooth into its socket if you can, and hold it gently in place
4. If reinsertion isn't possible, store the tooth in milk, saline, or between your cheek and gum
5. Get there straight away — every minute counts

The team will work to reimplant and splint the tooth, giving it the best possible chance of lasting.

Cracked and fractured teeth

Treatment depends on how severe the fracture is. Minor chips are treated with smoothing or composite resin bonding. Moderate fractures typically need a dental crown to restore and protect the tooth. Severe fractures may require root canal therapy and a crown, or extraction if the tooth can't be saved.

Dental abscess

A dental abscess needs professional treatment without delay. The team will drain the abscess, remove the source of infection through root canal therapy or extraction, and prescribe antibiotics to address any remaining infection. Don't try to pop a dental abscess yourself, and avoid applying heat — get professional care as soon as you can.

Lost or broken fillings and crowns

A lost filling or crown leaves your tooth exposed and sensitive. The clinic can place replacement fillings, re-cement a loose crown, or fabricate a new crown where needed. In many cases, thanks to on-site CAD/CAM technology, same-day crowns are an option.

Soft tissue injuries

Lacerations to the gums, lips, tongue, or cheeks can need professional attention to stop bleeding and heal properly. The team will assess the injury, clean the area, and place sutures if required.

CAD/CAM same-day restorations

Core Dental Group South Melbourne has CAD/CAM (Computer-Aided Design/Computer-Aided Manufacturing) technology on-site. In many emergency cases requiring a crown or other restoration, the team can design, mill, and fit the restoration in a single visit — no temporary crown, no second appointment. That's a real advantage when you're dealing with an emergency.

Emergency care for children

The South Melbourne team is experienced in managing children's dental emergencies with a calm, reassuring approach. One important thing to know: a knocked-out baby tooth should not be reimplanted — doing so can damage the developing permanent tooth underneath. Call the clinic for guidance before taking any action.

Getting to Core Dental Group South Melbourne

The Market Street clinic is easy to reach from across the inner south of Melbourne.

Tram routes 96 and 12 service South Melbourne directly, connecting to the CBD, St Kilda, and Port Melbourne, with stops close to Market Street. Street parking is available on Market Street and surrounding streets, and the South Melbourne Market car park is within easy walking distance. On foot, the clinic is steps from South Melbourne Market, walking distance from Clarendon Street, and close to the Albert Park and Port Melbourne neighbourhoods. Several bus routes also service South Melbourne, with stops near the clinic.

Preventing dental emergencies

Many dental emergencies can be prevented — or at least reduced in severity — with some straightforward habits.

Keeping up with regular check-ups lets dentists spot decay, cracks, and gum disease before they turn into emergencies. Six-monthly check-ups are recommended for most patients. Wearing a custom mouthguard for sport matters too — dental trauma is one of the most common sports injuries in Australia, and a custom mouthguard offers far better protection than over-the-counter options.

Using your teeth as tools — opening bottles, tearing packaging, holding objects — puts unnecessary stress on them and raises the risk of fractures. And small problems are worth acting on early: sensitivity, a tiny chip, a slightly loose filling. These things rarely sort themselves out and often get worse over time. If you grind your teeth, a custom nightguard can protect against the cracks and fractures that bruxism tends to cause over time.

Private health insurance and emergency dental costs

Emergency dental costs vary depending on what treatment is needed. Core Dental Group South Melbourne accepts all major private health funds, and the team can help you make the most of your cover.

It's worth contacting your health fund before your appointment to check what emergency dental treatment you're covered for. The reception team can also answer questions about fees and payment options. For patients without private health insurance, transparent pricing is available, and flexible payment arrangements can be discussed.

Frequently asked questions

****How soon can I be seen for a dental emergency at Core Dental Group South Melbourne?***

Emergency patients are prioritised, and the clinic aims to see urgent cases the same day wherever possible. Call as soon as your emergency happens and the team will do everything they can to get you in quickly.

****Does Medicare cover emergency dental treatment?***

Medicare generally does not cover emergency dental treatment for adults. However, eligible children may be able to access services under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS). Core Dental Group South Melbourne is registered under the CDBS — speak with the team about whether your child qualifies.

****Can I access my records from another Core Dental Group clinic?***

Yes. Core Dental Group uses CareStack, a shared clinical records platform across the entire group. Your records from any Core Dental Group or Smile Solutions location are accessible at the South Melbourne clinic.

****What if I need care after hours?***

Contact the clinic using the details on the website for after-hours emergency guidance. The team will advise on what options are available.

****Do you offer same-day crowns for emergency cases?***

In many cases, yes. The on-site CAD/CAM technology allows the team to design, fabricate, and fit crowns in a single appointment for appropriate emergency cases.
