### ### General dentistry

### ## Dental anxiety

- **Digital X-rays** — significantly lower radiation exposure than traditional film X-rays, with instant image availability and better diagnostic detail - **Intraoral cameras** — small cameras that let patients see exactly what the dentist sees inside the mouth - **OPG panoramic imaging** — a full-mouth X-ray covering the jaw and surrounding structures, useful for implant planning and orthodontic assessment - **CAD/CAM technology** — computer-aided design and manufacturing that can enable same-day crowns in some cases - **Digital smile design** — software that lets patients visualise proposed cosmetic changes before treatment starts - **Laser dentistry** — used in some procedures to reduce bleeding, improve precision, and minimise discomfort

### ## Dental implants

Dental implants have changed how tooth loss is managed. Unlike removable dentures or traditional bridges, implants are anchored directly into the jawbone, giving replacement teeth a stable, permanent base.

The process typically involves several stages:

1. **Consultation and planning** — detailed examination, X-rays, and often a CT scan to assess bone volume and plan placement precisely
2. **Implant placement** — a titanium post is surgically inserted into the jawbone under local anaesthetic; sedation is available for anxious patients
3. **Osseointegration** — over roughly three to six months, the implant fuses with the surrounding bone
4. **Abutment placement** — a connector piece is attached once osseointegration is confirmed
5. **Crown placement** — a custom-made porcelain crown is fitted to the abutment, completing the

restoration

Implants can also support implant-retained dentures, which are considerably more stable and comfortable than conventional removable dentures — a meaningful difference for patients who have experienced significant tooth loss.

With proper care, dental implants can last a lifetime, which makes the higher upfront cost more reasonable when weighed against the long-term alternative.

## ## Orthodontics and teeth straightening

Orthodontic treatment isn't just for teenagers in metal braces anymore. Modern options are discreet, comfortable, and work well for adults.

Clear aligner therapy — including Invisalign — uses a series of custom-made, removable plastic trays to shift teeth gradually into position. Because the aligners are transparent, they're barely noticeable during wear, which is why they're popular with adult patients.

The practical advantages:

- **Appearance** — nearly invisible during wear
- **Removability** — trays come out for eating, drinking, brushing, and flossing
- **Comfort** — smooth plastic edges are less likely to irritate soft tissues than metal brackets and wires

## ## Medicare and health fund information

Dental treatment isn't covered under Medicare for most adults in Australia, though some government programmes can help eligible patients.

### ### Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS)

The CDBS gives eligible children aged 0–17 access to a benefit cap for basic dental services over a two-calendar-year period. Covered services include examinations, X-rays, cleaning, fissure sealants, fillings, root canals, and extractions. Orthodontic and cosmetic dental services are not covered.

Core Dental Group is registered to provide services under the CDBS. Families should check eligibility through Services Australia (Medicare) and bring relevant documentation to their appointment.

### ### Private health insurance

Many Australians have private health insurance with dental extras cover, though what's included varies considerably between funds and policies. It's worth knowing what your policy actually covers before committing to treatment.

Core Dental Group works with all major health funds and has HICAPS on-site, so patients can claim their rebate at the time of payment. There's no need to lodge a separate claim — patients simply pay the gap on the day.

### ### Payment plans

Dental treatment can be a significant expense, particularly for restorative or cosmetic work. **\*\*Respiratory health:\*\*** Bacteria from the mouth can be inhaled into the lungs, potentially contributing to respiratory infections such as pneumonia — particularly in older adults or those with compromised immune systems.

**\*\*Mental health:\*\*** Pain, tooth loss, and aesthetic concerns all affect self-esteem, social confidence, and quality of life in ways that are easy to underestimate.

Core Dental Group takes a whole-person view of oral health, recognising that the mouth doesn't function in isolation from the rest of the body.

## ## Visiting Core Dental Group – what to expect
