The clinical team at Core Dental Group Bayside includes experienced general dentists, dental hygienists, and dental therapists, with access to AHPRA-registered visiting and on-site specialists through the Core Specialist Support Centre (CSSC). The specialist disciplines available through the CSSC model include:

- Periodontology (specialist gum disease treatment) - Endodontics (specialist root canal treatment) - Oral and maxillofacial surgery - Prosthodontics (specialist complex restorations and implants) - Paediatric dentistry specialist (specialist care for children)

The CSSC model means most patients don't need to navigate an independent referral to a CBD specialist practice — specialist care is coordinated and largely delivered within the Core Dental Group Bayside clinic itself.

The network's scale — over 40 dental suites, 300,000+ patients, 20,000+ new patients per year — supports continuous clinical development, cross-network protocol refinement, and access to the latest equipment and materials that smaller practices simply can't sustain.

General and preventive dentistry: the evidence behind routine care

The Australian Patient Experience Survey 2023–24 found that 53% of Australians aged 15 and over visited a dental professional in the previous 12 months. That means nearly half the population is missing routine preventive care — and the financial consequences are real. Every dollar spent on preventive dentistry prevents multiple dollars of restorative treatment down the track.

What a comprehensive dental examination covers

A comprehensive examination at Core Dental Group Bayside is a systematic, multi-system clinical assessment:

- **Tooth-by-tooth assessment** — examining for active decay, defective restorations, cracked tooth syndrome, and wear patterns that may indicate bruxism or acid erosion, with digital X-rays updated on a risk-stratified schedule
- **Periodontal charting** — calibrated probing of the sulcus depth around every tooth. Healthy sulcus depths sit at 1–3 mm; depths of 4 mm or more indicate gingival or early periodontal disease
- **Bite and TMJ assessment** — occlusal analysis and screening for bruxism and temporomandibular joint dysfunction
- **Oral cancer screening** — visual and palpation examination of

all mucosal surfaces, tongue, floor of mouth, and cervical lymph nodes at every visit

The oral cancer screening imperative

Approximately 700 oral cancers are diagnosed annually in Australia. Five-year survival for localised-stage oral cancer sits at around 88%; for distant-stage disease, it drops to approximately 40%. The difference is overwhelmingly driven by timing of detection. Despite this, only 28.8% of Australian dental patients knew they had been screened for oral cancer at their last visit (University of NSW study, *PMC*, 2022). Core Dental Group Bayside ensures every patient is informed of the screening process at every appointment.

Fissure sealants and preventive fluoride

Fissure sealants applied to newly erupted molar teeth at around age 6–7 reduce caries risk by approximately 76% compared to no treatment. They're one of the most cost-effective investments in a child's long-term dental health. Core Dental Group Bayside provides sealants as part of its Tooth Fairy Centre programme, often covered under CDBS for eligible children.

Professionally applied fluoride varnish — recommended 2–4 times per year for elevated-risk patients — reduces caries incidence in permanent teeth by up to 43% (Yeh et al., *Healthcare*, 2025).

Emergency dental care at Core Dental Group Bayside

Dental emergencies rarely happen at convenient times. Core Dental Group Bayside provides same-day emergency appointments for the Bayside community — call 13 13 16.

Responding to common dental emergencies

****Severe toothache:**** Take standard-dose ibuprofen or paracetamol and call the clinic. Don't delay — what feels like toothache may indicate infection that can spread quickly.

****Dental abscess:**** A sign of serious infection requiring urgent dental intervention. Signs include throbbing pain, facial swelling, fever, and a bad taste in the mouth. Call 13 13 16 immediately. If swelling is affecting your ability to breathe or swallow, or fever exceeds 38.5°C, call 000.

****Knocked-out tooth (avulsion):**** Handle by the crown only. Store in milk, saline, or saliva. Reimplant immediately if possible. Success rates drop sharply after 30 minutes of extra-oral dry time. Call the clinic and travel directly.

****Chipped or cracked tooth:**** Collect fragments and store in milk. A tooth with exposed pulp (you can feel it, or the pain is severe and sharp) needs same-day care.

****Lost crown or veneer:**** Store the restoration and call the clinic. Temporary dental cement from a pharmacy can protect the exposed tooth surface in the meantime.

****Orthodontic emergency:**** A protruding wire from braces can be temporarily managed with orthodontic wax. For a loose bracket or aligner issue, call the clinic.

Children's dentistry and the Tooth Fairy Centre at Core Dental Group Bayside

The ****Tooth Fairy Centre**** is Core Dental Group's dedicated children's dental programme, running at every clinic in the network, including Core Dental Group Bayside. It's built on the evidence-based principle that children who have positive dental experiences early develop lifelong healthy oral hygiene habits and are far less likely to develop dental anxiety.

Core Dental Group Bayside welcomes children from their very first dental visit — recommended within six months of the first tooth or by the first birthday. The clinical team uses the tell-show-do technique for all paediatric visits, making sure children understand and feel comfortable with every step before it happens.

Bayside families and CDBS

For families in Brighton, Hampton, Sandringham, and surrounding suburbs receiving Family Tax Benefit Part A or equivalent, the Child Dental Benefits Schedule provides up to \$1,158 per eligible child over two calendar years. This covers: - Check-ups and examinations - Professional cleans - X-rays - Fissure sealants - Fillings - Extractions - Baby tooth root canal treatment (pulpotomy)

Eligibility is automatic — no application needed. The clinic can confirm eligibility at booking. Core Dental Group Bayside is a registered CDBS provider.

Children's sedation

For children with significant dental anxiety, developmental considerations, or complex treatment requirements, nitrous oxide sedation and IV sedation are available. Specialist paediatric dentist referral through the CSSC is available for the most complex cases.

Cosmetic dentistry for Bayside patients

Porcelain veneers

The aesthetic gold standard. Porcelain veneers have a published 10-year survival rate of approximately 95.5% — making them one of the most durable cosmetic restorations available. They offer superior stain resistance, light translucency that mimics natural enamel, and the most transformative outcomes for smile makeovers.

Preparation involves removing approximately 0.3–0.5 mm of enamel from the front tooth surface. Preparation-free ("no-prep") and minimal-prep designs are available for appropriate cases where enamel preservation is possible.

Composite veneers and direct bonding

Composite bonding offers the fastest route to cosmetic improvement — completed in a single appointment, fully reversible, and requiring little to no enamel removal. It's well-suited for chipped teeth, minor spacing, and mild discolouration. Composite veneers typically last 5–7 years with good care before polishing or replacement is needed.

Teeth whitening

In-chair whitening can achieve up to 8–10 shade improvements in a single session. Custom take-home whitening trays achieve equivalent results over 10–14 days. Core Dental Group Bayside offers both options, with the choice guided by patient preference and clinical assessment.

Full smile makeovers and digital smile design

For patients seeking comprehensive transformation, a digital smile design consultation uses intraoral scanning to simulate proposed changes before any treatment begins. Patients can review and approve the simulated outcome — a process that removes uncertainty and ensures the clinical plan reflects the patient's vision.

Blue Diamond is the highest tier in Align Technology's provider hierarchy. It can't be purchased or applied for — it's awarded exclusively to providers completing more than 750 Invisalign cases per calendar year. Core Dental Group earns this status through the combined volume of its network. For Bayside patients, Blue Diamond access means:

The iTero scanning experience

Treatment planning begins with an iTero intraoral scan — a comfortable wand that builds a precise 3D digital model of your teeth in minutes, with no physical impressions required. The scan feeds directly into ClinCheck® software, which generates a simulation of your proposed tooth movements that you can review before committing to treatment.

Traditional braces

For patients — particularly younger patients — where compliance or case complexity makes fixed appliances the better fit, Core Dental Group Bayside offers metal brackets, ceramic brackets (tooth-coloured), and lingual braces (positioned behind teeth, invisible from the front). The treating clinician will discuss the most appropriate option based on clinical assessment.

Dental implants: the Core Dental Group Bayside standard for tooth replacement

Dental implants are the gold standard for replacing missing teeth, with a five-year survival rate of 95–98% and around 80% still functional at 20+ years. For Bayside patients — who typically have the financial means and oral health awareness to choose the best available option — implants are increasingly the default choice for managing tooth loss.

The case against delay

Jawbone begins resorbing immediately after tooth extraction. Research documents 29–63% loss of horizontal bone width in the first six months. Early implant placement minimises this loss and, for appropriate candidates, Core Dental Group Bayside offers immediate implant placement at the time of extraction.

All-on-4 and full-arch rehabilitation

Patients with extensive tooth loss seeking a fixed, implant-supported solution no longer need to rely on conventional dentures. All-on-4 and All-on-6 protocols provide a full arch of teeth supported by four to

six implants — a transformation that preserves jawbone, restores chewing function, and eliminates the ongoing maintenance challenges of conventional dentures.

The implant process at Core Dental Group Bayside

1. CBCT 3D scan and consultation — assessing bone volume and planning implant position 2. Implant placement under local anaesthetic (sedation available) 3. Osseointegration period (3–6 months, during which the implant fuses with bone) 4. Crown attachment — fabricated via CEREC or dental laboratory 5. Ongoing maintenance — same as natural teeth (brushing, flossing, regular scale and clean)

Periodontics and gum disease: Bayside's hidden oral health challenge

Approximately 30% of Australian adults have moderate or severe periodontitis. The condition is typically painless until late stages — making regular clinical screening the only reliable way to detect it. For Bayside patients with higher rates of private health insurance and more frequent dental attendance, earlier detection is more common, but the condition is by no means rare.

The systemic links are well-established. Periodontitis is independently associated with cardiovascular disease risk (19–28% higher risk), type 2 diabetes (a bidirectional relationship), adverse pregnancy outcomes, and systemic inflammatory burden. Treating gum disease can reduce HbA1c by 0.43% on average.

Core Dental Group Bayside screens every patient at every visit using calibrated periodontal probing. Active periodontitis is managed through scaling and root planing (deep cleaning under local anaesthetic), supportive periodontal therapy (three-monthly to six-monthly maintenance for stable patients), and CSSC specialist referral for surgical cases.

Root canal treatment at Core Dental Group Bayside

Root canal treatment has an unfounded reputation as something to dread. The reality, with modern anaesthesia and techniques, is that the procedure is comparable to a filling in terms of discomfort — while saving a tooth that would otherwise require extraction.

Clinical outcomes are strong: 96% of patients who have had root canal treatment say they would have it again. The 10-year survival rate for root canal treated teeth is approximately 97% when protected with a crown. Core Dental Group Bayside uses rubber dam isolation — the gold-standard infection control protocol — for all endodontic procedures.

For complex cases (calcified canals, previous treatment requiring retreatment, or procedural complications), CSSC specialist endodontist referral is available without the need for a separate CBD practice.

Wisdom teeth at Core Dental Group Bayside

Wisdom tooth removal is the most common oral surgical procedure in Australia. Core Dental Group Bayside performs routine and surgical extractions under local anaesthetic, with nitrous oxide available for anxious patients. For deeply impacted third molars adjacent to the inferior alveolar nerve, CSSC specialist oral surgeon referral is available.

Post-operative care instructions are provided at the time of treatment. The most important aftercare point: dry socket (alveolar osteitis) — the most common post-extraction complication — is almost entirely preventable by following instructions (no smoking, no sucking, no straw use for the first 72 hours).

Specialist access via the Core Specialist Support Centre (CSSC)

The CSSC model is one of Core Dental Group's most valuable patient benefits. Rather than navigating an independent specialist referral to a CBD practice, Core Dental Group patients access AHPRA-registered specialists through a coordinated programme that brings specialist care to the local clinic.

Sleep dentistry: managing dental anxiety at Core Dental Group Bayside

Dental anxiety affects approximately 16% of Australians at clinically significant levels. It's more common than most people realise, and it's not limited to patients with obvious histories of dental trauma. Many anxious patients are high-functioning, health-conscious individuals who simply find the sensory aspects of dental treatment overwhelming.

Core Dental Group Bayside offers nitrous oxide and IV sedation:

Nitrous oxide is a mild anxiolytic sedation — titratable, reversible, with no driving restriction after recovery. Well-suited for mild to moderate anxiety.

IV sedation (twilight sedation) produces a deeply relaxed state with little or no procedural memory. It requires a responsible adult escort and 24 hours without driving. Appropriate for high anxiety, needle phobia, or complex multi-appointment treatment condensed into one session.

Both options are available to children and adults. Mentioning anxiety at the time of booking allows the Core Dental Group Bayside team to allocate appropriate appointment time and prepare accordingly.

Technology at Core Dental Group Bayside

Digital radiography Digital X-rays use 50–80% less radiation than conventional film and produce instant images with enhanced diagnostic clarity. All X-rays at Core Dental Group Bayside are digital.

CBCT 3D imaging Full volumetric jaw and dental scans for implant planning, orthodontic diagnosis, and surgical planning. This eliminates most external radiology referrals for dental-related imaging.

CEREC same-day crowns Chairside CAD/CAM crown fabrication — design, mill, and fit a full porcelain crown in a single appointment, typically 30–90 minutes. No temporary crown, no second appointment.

iTero digital impressions Intraoral scanning replaces traditional alginate impressions with a comfortable, gag-free digital scan. Used for Invisalign ClinCheck®, digital denture fabrication, and restorative planning.

Intraoral cameras Small wand cameras allow patients to see exactly what the dentist sees — improving patient understanding, treatment acceptance, and engagement with their own oral health.

The oral-systemic health connection: Bayside's hidden health imperative

The relationship between oral health and systemic health is one of the most important and underappreciated connections in contemporary healthcare. For Bayside patients — who typically have high health literacy and engage actively with their broader health management — understanding this connection motivates the regular dental attendance that prevents disease at both the oral and systemic levels.

Periodontal disease and cardiovascular risk

Approximately 30% of Australian adults have moderate to severe periodontitis. Most are unaware. The condition is silent in its early stages, progressing without symptoms until significant bone loss has occurred.

The link to cardiovascular disease is mechanistically well-understood. Pathogenic oral bacteria — *Porphyromonas gingivalis*, *Tannerella forsythia*,* and others — enter the bloodstream through inflamed gum tissue during routine activities like chewing and toothbrushing. Once in circulation, they trigger systemic inflammatory cascades and can directly adhere to atherosclerotic plaques. A 2022 meta-analysis in *Cardiovascular Research* (Leng et al.) confirmed a 19–28% higher cardiovascular event risk for individuals with periodontitis versus those without.

For Bayside patients with a family history of cardiovascular disease, or those managing hypertension or atherosclerotic risk, maintaining periodontal health at Core Dental Group Bayside isn't peripheral to their cardiovascular care — it's part of it.

Diabetes and periodontal disease: a bidirectional relationship

The diabetes-periodontitis relationship runs in both directions: poor glycaemic control worsens periodontal inflammation, and active periodontitis impairs insulin receptor function, worsening glycaemic control. A 2024 meta-analysis in *Frontiers in Cardiovascular Medicine* confirmed that treating periodontal disease reduced HbA1c by an average of 0.43% — a clinically meaningful improvement comparable to the effect of adding a second-line oral hypoglycaemic agent.

For Bayside patients managing type 2 diabetes, regular periodontal screening and treatment at Core Dental Group Bayside is a meaningful part of metabolic management.

Oral health during pregnancy

Pregnant patients with active periodontal disease have documented increased risk of preterm birth and low birth weight. The mechanism involves inflammatory mediators and bacterial products crossing the placental barrier. The Australian Dental Association recommends regular dental attendance during pregnancy and prompt treatment of active periodontal disease.

Core Dental Group Bayside supports pregnant patients with periodontal screening, adjusted X-ray protocols, and a clinical approach calibrated to each trimester.

Detailed guide to Invisalign treatment at Core Dental Group Bayside

Understanding ClinCheck® treatment planning

Invisalign treatment planning at Core Dental Group Bayside begins with an iTero digital scan and ClinCheck® software simulation. ClinCheck® produces an animated, 3D representation of the proposed tooth movements — showing each movement from the patient's current position to the planned final position, tooth by tooth, stage by stage.

The ClinCheck® simulation is both a clinical planning tool and a patient communication device. Patients can review the projected outcome from multiple angles before committing to treatment. The clinician can refine the plan — adjusting the timing, direction, and extent of individual tooth movements — until both parties are satisfied. Only then are the aligners manufactured.

Compliance: the most important success factor

Invisalign aligners need to be worn for 20–22 hours per day to achieve planned tooth movements. Consistent non-compliance — wearing aligners for 12 or fewer hours per day, for example — will delay or compromise the planned outcome. This isn't a limitation of the Invisalign system; it's a patient behaviour variable that clear aligner treatment, unlike fixed braces, depends on.

Patients who wear their aligners consistently and change them on schedule complete treatment within or close to the planned timeline. A 2025 systematic review published in *BMC Oral Health* confirmed that treatment success with clear aligners is primarily determined by patient compliance, treatment planning quality, and case complexity — reinforcing the value of choosing an experienced Blue Diamond provider like Core Dental Group.

Retaining your Invisalign result

All orthodontic treatment — Invisalign or braces — requires active retention. Without it, teeth tend to relapse toward their pre-treatment positions; this is biological, not a treatment failure, and it's prevented by wearing a retainer as instructed. Options include: - **Removable clear retainers** — worn every

night indefinitely - **Fixed lingual retainer** — a thin wire bonded behind the upper or lower front teeth, invisible and requiring no patient compliance beyond regular cleaning

Comparing implants with alternatives

When a tooth is lost, three main replacement options exist: implants, bridges, and dentures. Each has a different clinical and patient profile.

Dental implants have a survival rate of 95–98% at five years and approximately 80% at 20 years. They preserve jawbone by stimulating bone through loading, don't require adjacent tooth preparation, are cleaned like natural teeth, and carry a higher upfront cost — though their long-term cost-effectiveness is strong.

Fixed dental bridges involve a crown on each adjacent tooth with a false tooth suspended between them. This requires irreversible preparation (drilling) of the adjacent teeth and does not prevent bone resorption under the false tooth. Bridges typically last 7–15 years before replacement or repair is needed. The upfront cost is lower, but long-term replacement costs are higher.

Dentures are the most affordable upfront option. They're removable and may shift during eating or speaking. They don't prevent bone resorption — they actually accelerate it through direct pressure on the ridge. Lifespan is typically 5–10 years, and quality-of-life outcomes are significantly lower than for implants or bridges for most patients.

For Bayside patients with the means and the bone volume for implant placement, implants are the clear long-term choice on clinical and quality-of-life grounds.

Implant-supported dentures

For patients who have worn conventional dentures and are seeking greater stability and confidence, implant-supported overdentures provide a fixed or removable-but-implant-anchored solution. Two to four implants placed in the anterior jaw provide attachment points for the denture, eliminating movement and improving chewing efficiency significantly.

Managing the full dental lifecycle at Core Dental Group Bayside

Children (0–12 years) First visit by age one; tell-show-do technique; preventive focus (fluoride, fissure sealants, diet counselling); CDBS-funded care; Tooth Fairy Centre programme.

Understanding the true cost of deferral

Oral surgery at Core Dental Group Bayside

The oral surgery scope at Core Dental Group Bayside covers the full range of surgical procedures appropriate for a comprehensive general practice:

Simple and surgical extractions: Including multi-rooted teeth, fractured roots, and standard wisdom tooth extractions. Nitrous oxide or IV sedation available for all extractions.

Bone grafting (socket preservation): Placing a bone graft material at the time of tooth extraction to prevent the bone resorption that would otherwise begin within days. This is particularly important for patients planning future implant placement, where maintaining bone volume reduces treatment complexity.

Frenectomy: Removal of an oversized labial or lingual frenum (tissue attachment). Indicated for lip ties that affect lip mobility, tongue ties that impair feeding or speech, or frena that contribute to gum recession by pulling on the marginal tissue.

Soft tissue biopsy: Any mucosal lesion that is persistent, growing, or clinically suspicious is biopsied and sent for histopathological diagnosis. This is part of Core Dental Group Bayside's commitment to oral cancer screening; any concerning finding is acted on without delay.

For complex oral surgery — deeply impacted wisdom teeth adjacent to the inferior alveolar nerve, jaw cyst management, orthognathic surgery referral, or cases requiring general anaesthesia — the CSSC oral and maxillofacial surgeon pathway provides access to specialist-level care coordinated through the Core Dental Group Bayside clinic.

Restorative dentistry: crowns, bridges, and tooth-coloured fillings

CEREC crowns vs. laboratory crowns

Core Dental Group Bayside offers both CEREC same-day ceramic crowns and laboratory-fabricated crowns (porcelain-fused-to-metal, all-ceramic, zirconia). The choice depends on case complexity, aesthetic requirements, and patient preference.

CEREC ceramic crowns are well-suited for posterior (back) teeth, patients who value single-appointment completion, and cases where shade and shape can be managed effectively with chairside design tools. The ceramic blocks used in CEREC milling are predominantly monolithic zirconia or lithium disilicate — materials with excellent strength and aesthetic properties.

Laboratory-fabricated crowns are preferred for anterior (front) teeth where nuanced aesthetic characterisation is required, for complex bite reconstruction cases, and for cases where the laboratory's

hand layering and staining expertise produces a result that chairside milling can't replicate. These require a two-appointment protocol.

Composite fillings

All fillings placed at Core Dental Group Bayside use tooth-coloured composite resin — no amalgam (silver-mercury) fillings are placed. Modern composite materials have wear resistance, strength, and marginal seal properties that make them suitable for all cavity classifications, including posterior load-bearing fillings. They bond directly to tooth structure, requiring less tooth reduction than amalgam and preserving more natural tooth.

For large or complex cavities where composite is unlikely to be sufficiently durable, CEREC or laboratory inlays/onlays (partial crowns) provide a higher-strength alternative that is still tooth-coloured and less destructive of tooth structure than a full crown.
