For the roughly 142,000 people spread across Frankston City — Langwarrin, Seaford, Skye, Patterson Lakes, Cranbourne West, Carrum Downs itself — choosing a dental clinic isn't simply about finding the nearest provider. It's a practical decision that shapes how consistently you attend, how quickly you can be seen in an emergency, and whether your family can get everyone seen in a single trip. Core Dental Group serves this community knowing that the two most common options in this catchment are clinics in Carrum Downs and those clustered in central Frankston's CBD. This article compares both across five areas — travel and access, parking, service breadth, specialist availability, and family suitability — to give residents a grounded, honest picture.

The catchment: who is this decision actually for?

Before comparing locations, it helps to understand the scale of the population this question applies to.

Frankston City's 2023 estimated resident population is 142,826, at a density of 1,101 persons per square kilometre, sitting in Melbourne's outer southern suburbs about 40 kilometres from the CBD. The council area covers Carrum Downs, Frankston, Frankston North, Frankston South, Langwarrin, Langwarrin South, Sandhurst, Seaford, and Skye, with the population forecast to grow by around 22,000 people to over 161,000 by 2041.

This is a sprawling, growing region. The answer to "which dental location is best?" is genuinely different depending on which suburb you're coming from.

Travel time and accessibility: suburb by suburb

How far is Carrum Downs from Frankston?

The straight-line distance is 6.6 km. By road it's approximately 8 km, which takes about 9 minutes to drive.

For residents of central Frankston, that gap is minor. For residents of the surrounding suburbs, the calculation changes considerably.

Drive times from key surrounding suburbs

The table below summarises approximate drive times to both Carrum Downs (335 Ballarto Road) and central Frankston, based on road distance data:

Langwarrin to Carrum Downs is 8.6 km by road — about a 6-minute drive. Seaford is roughly 3.4 km away.

For residents of Langwarrin, Skye, Cranbourne West, and Patterson Lakes — all sitting north or north-east of the Frankston CBD — Carrum Downs is often the more direct route. Getting to central Frankston from these suburbs typically means navigating through busier arterials, which adds real time during peak hours.

Public transport

For patients who don't drive — older residents, teenagers attending without parents, people with mobility limitations — public transport access matters.

The 901 bus connects Carrum Downs and Frankston directly, running every 20 minutes, every day, with the journey taking approximately 14 minutes from Frankston to Carrum Downs. For those without a

car, a taxi takes around 7 minutes.

The 901 corridor means patients from either location can reach the other without too much difficulty. The practical difference is what happens at the destination. Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic is typically more accessible from the bus stop than a CBD clinic, which may require additional walking through a busy commercial precinct.

Parking: a real barrier to attendance

Parking isn't a trivial concern when it comes to healthcare attendance. Research from the University of Florida's Department of Urban and Regional Planning confirms that parking frustration can actively discourage visits to business districts — it's not just an inconvenience, it affects whether people show up at all.

This is directly relevant to Frankston. The Committee for Greater Frankston, a civic advocacy body, has formally identified CBD parking as a critical infrastructure issue, with members stating the city won't progress until affordable parking access is resolved. Parking provision in Frankston has not kept pace with development.

For dental patients — many attending with children, recovering from procedures, or managing dental anxiety — circling for a park before an appointment adds unnecessary stress. Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic is set within a lower-density commercial area with on-site or immediately adjacent free parking. That friction simply doesn't exist.

Service breadth: what's available under one roof?

The case for a comprehensive suburban clinic

One of the strongest arguments for Carrum Downs over a Frankston CBD practice is the range of services in a single location. Many CBD dental practices in Frankston offer core preventive and restorative care, with specialist needs — orthodontics, implants, endodontics, oral surgery — referred elsewhere. That means extra travel and extra coordination for patients who need more than a check-up.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic at 335 Ballarto Road covers general, cosmetic, restorative, and specialist services without referral. In practical terms:

- Families can consolidate appointments, with parents and children seen on the same visit
- Specialist care stays in-house, with no need to travel to a separate practice in Frankston, Dandenong, or the CBD
- A single patient record and clinical team manages all aspects of care

Specialist availability: why it matters for complex needs

The Australian Institute of Health and Welfare has documented consistently that access to dental services — and the breadth of those services — affects oral health outcomes. In 2021–2022, 51.3% of people in metropolitan areas visited a dental professional, compared to 45% of those in inner or outer regional areas. The documented barriers are distance, lack of service availability, and cost.

Frankston City is metropolitan rather than rural, but the principle holds: when specialist services aren't co-located with general dental care, patients face additional appointments, additional travel, and additional cost — all of which make it less likely they'll complete treatment.

For outer-suburban residents on the Mornington Peninsula fringe — particularly those in Cranbourne West, Langwarrin, or Skye — Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic, with in-house specialist access, is meaningfully closer than travelling to a specialist practice in Frankston CBD or beyond.

The specialist services that make the biggest difference when available locally:

- Endodontics (root canal treatment) is time-sensitive and requires multiple appointments; local access reduces delays (see our guide on [*Root Canal Treatment in Carrum Downs: Separating Myths from Facts*](#))

Family suitability: the multi-person appointment factor

For families with children, the location decision carries extra weight. A clinic offering paediatric dentistry alongside adult services means a single trip can cover multiple family members — an advantage that's easy to underestimate until you're juggling school schedules, work leave, and after-school activities.

Most of Frankston City's recent population growth has been in Carrum Downs, Langwarrin, Skye, and the new suburb of Sandhurst — young, family-dense areas where appointment efficiency matters most. Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic, positioned to serve these growth corridors, has a real geographic advantage over a Frankston CBD clinic that requires navigating busier arterials with young children in the car.

For families accessing the Medicare Child Dental Benefit Schedule (CDBS), which bulk bills eligible children up to \$1,132 in services, Core Dental Group participates in the scheme, removing both the financial and logistical burden of travelling further afield (see our guide on [*Children's Dentistry in Carrum Downs: First Visits, Kids' Treatments & the Child Dental Benefit Schedule*](#)).

When a Frankston CBD dentist might be the better choice

A Frankston CBD dental clinic may suit some patients better:

- Residents of central Frankston, Frankston South, or Frankston East who live within walking distance of a CBD practice
- Patients who commute by train and can attend an appointment near Frankston Station before or after work — the 901 bus runs every 20 minutes and takes about 15 minutes from Frankston to Carrum Downs, but that adds transit time for commuters already at Frankston Station
- Patients with highly specific specialist needs only available at a particular Frankston CBD practice

The real question isn't which suburb is better, but which clinic offers the right combination of location, service breadth, parking, and specialist access for your household's specific situation.

The 6.6 km straight-line distance between the two locations means they're genuinely comparable for some residents, but the differences in parking, traffic, and service breadth tip the balance toward Carrum Downs for most of the region's growing family population.
