## ## Overview

The Frankston corridor is one of south-east Melbourne's most distinct communities — outer-suburban in character, growing steadily, and with a clear local identity. For the more than 142,000 residents of the City of Frankston, and the roughly 22,000 people living in Carrum Downs itself, geography has historically meant a real trade-off: stay local and accept limited options, or make the 40-plus kilometre trip to the CBD for specialist-level care.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic is at Suite 5, 335 Ballarto Road, a few minutes from Carrum Downs Shopping Centre. It's a full-service practice, part of Core Dental Group, which was founded in 1993 and operates alongside Smile Solutions, one of Australia's largest dental organisations. Together, they serve more than 300,000 patients, with around 20,000 new patients coming through the door each year.

The financial reality of dental care in Australia is worth stating plainly: around 61% of total dental expenditure — approximately \$7.6 billion — comes directly from patients' pockets. Australians spent an average of \$291 on dental services per person over a 12-month period, not counting private health insurance premiums. For families in Carrum Downs, Frankston, Langwarrin, and Seaford managing the real costs of outer-suburban life, that adds up quickly. Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic addresses this directly: CDBS bulk billing for eligible children, all major private health funds processed

via HICAPS, and Payright interest-free payment plans for larger treatment costs.

## Why dental care in Carrum Downs matters more than you might think

### The national oral health challenge and its local dimension

Australia's dental system has a structural quirk: universal healthcare that largely leaves dentistry out. Unlike a GP visit, dental care sits mostly outside Medicare, creating out-of-pocket costs that fall hardest on lower-income households, outer-suburban families, and those without private health insurance. The data reflects this clearly.

In 2023–24, around 88,600 hospitalisations for dental conditions across Australia could have been avoided with earlier treatment. About 3 in 10 people who needed to see a dental professional in the previous 12 months delayed or skipped care; roughly 2 in 10 said cost was the reason. For a community like Carrum Downs, sitting 40–45 kilometres from Melbourne's CBD and outside the natural catchment of inner-city dental providers, this access gap is felt in a very real way.

Oral disease doesn't stay in the mouth. There's solid evidence linking periodontal disease to cardiovascular disease risk, type 2 diabetes management, adverse pregnancy outcomes, and systemic inflammation. A 2024 review in *\*Frontiers in Cardiovascular Medicine\** confirmed that treating periodontal disease improved glycaemic control in type 2 diabetic patients by a mean reduction of 0.43% in HbA1c — a clinically meaningful result. For a community with an older demographic profile and the associated prevalence of systemic conditions, this connection matters directly to local health outcomes.

### The Frankston corridor's specific dental access context

The City of Frankston had an estimated resident population of around 142,000 as of 2025, with Carrum Downs contributing approximately 22,000 of that total. The area has seen steady residential growth driven by housing affordability and improving infrastructure, with new families arriving from Melbourne's inner suburbs and from interstate.

A few demographic factors shape dental care demand in this corridor:

- A higher-than-average proportion of children and young families creates strong demand for paediatric dentistry, orthodontics, and CDBS-funded services.
- Many residents commute into Melbourne's CBD or other activity centres, making early morning and Saturday appointment availability genuinely important.
- The region's growing cultural diversity creates demand for multilingual care and culturally sensitive clinical communication.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic is set up to meet these needs. With early weekday starts, Saturday appointments, and a team experienced in communicating complex dental decisions to patients from a range of backgrounds, it's the dental home for thousands of Frankston corridor families.

## The Core Dental Group team: group scale, local expertise

What sets Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic apart from a standard suburban practice isn't just the range of services — it's the clinical infrastructure behind them.

Established in 1993 and owned and operated by a dentist, Core Dental Group works alongside Smile Solutions, one of Australia's largest dental practices. Together, these affiliated practices have built a patient base exceeding 300,000 individuals, with around 20,000 new patients joining each year. The orthodontic programme alone welcomes more than 3,000 new patients annually, with over one-third starting Invisalign treatment — a volume that has earned Core Dental Group Blue Diamond Invisalign provider status, the highest tier awarded by Align Technology.

The network gives patients access to over 40 dental suites equipped with CEREC units, iTero scanners, CBCT imaging, and multiple implant systems.

The clinical team at Core Dental Carrum Downs includes general dentists, registered dental hygienists, and dental therapists, with access to visiting and on-site registered specialists through the Core Specialist Support Centre (CSSC). Specialist disciplines available include periodontology, endodontics, oral and maxillofacial surgery, prosthodontics, and paediatric specialist care.

In Australia, the title "dental specialist" is legally protected and regulated by the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA). As of 2023, around 9.5% of employed dentists held specialist registration — a relatively small pool spread across the country. Having specialist-level access locally, rather than requiring a CBD referral, is a meaningful clinical advantage for Carrum Downs patients.

## ## General and preventive dentistry: the foundation of everything

Every complex dental treatment — every implant, every veneer, every orthodontic case — rests on sound preventive care. Understanding what happens at a general dentistry appointment at Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic, and why each component matters, is the starting point for every patient relationship.

The Patient Experience Survey 2023–24 found that just over half (53%) of Australians aged 15 and over visited a dental professional in the last 12 months. That means nearly half the population goes without the routine care that underpins long-term oral health — and the downstream cost is significant.

### ### What a comprehensive oral examination actually covers

A comprehensive oral examination at Core Dental Carrum Downs is a systematic, multi-system assessment. It covers:

**\*\*Tooth-by-tooth assessment\*\*** — probing for active decay, failing restorations, cracked tooth syndrome, and wear patterns indicating bruxism or acid erosion, supported by digital X-rays (recommended every 12–24 months depending on risk profile).

**\*\*Periodontal probing\*\*** — calibrated measurement of sulcus depth around each tooth to detect and stage gum disease. Healthy depths are 1–3 mm; readings of 4 mm or more indicate early to moderate periodontitis.

**\*\*Bite, jaw, and TMJ assessment\*\*** — evaluation of occlusion and screening for grinding habits that allow protective intervention before significant tooth structure is lost.

**\*\*Oral cancer screening\*\*** — a visual and tactile examination of all oral mucosal surfaces, tongue, floor of the mouth, and neck nodes.

The oral cancer screening component deserves particular attention. Around 700 cases of oral cancer are diagnosed each year in Australia. If detected early (localised stage), five-year survival rates approach 88%; for distant-stage disease, survival falls to around 40%. Despite this, only 28.8% of Australian dental patients surveyed knew they had been screened for oral cancer (University of NSW, \*PMC\*, 2022). Core Dental Group communicates the screening process at every visit.

### ### Fluoride treatments and fissure sealants

Professionally applied fluoride varnish, used two to four times per year for higher-risk patients, reduces dental caries incidence in permanent teeth by up to 43% (Yeh et al., \*Healthcare\*, 2025). Adults at elevated risk — those with exposed root surfaces, dry mouth from medications, or orthodontic appliances — benefit just as significantly as children.

Fissure sealants, applied to the biting surfaces of newly erupted molar teeth, reduce caries risk by around 76% compared to no sealant. Applied quickly and painlessly at around age six to seven, they're one of the most cost-effective investments in a child's long-term dental health.

### ## Emergency dental care: same-day access on the Frankston corridor

Dental emergencies are among the most common acute healthcare presentations in Australia, and among the most poorly served in outer-suburban growth corridors. The age-standardised rate of potentially preventable dental hospitalisations reached 3.4 per 1,000 population in 2023–24 — the highest in a decade. Many of these hospitalisations involve children; the rate for children aged 5–9 years was 12.1 per 1,000 population.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic typically sees urgent cases the same day, often within hours. If you have a dental emergency, call 13 13 16.

### ### Common dental emergencies and how to respond

**\*\*Toothache:\*\*** Take over-the-counter pain relief (ibuprofen or paracetamol at standard doses) and call the clinic for a same-day appointment. Don't place aspirin directly against the gum — this causes chemical burns.

**\*\*Knocked-out tooth (avulsion):\*\*** Handle by the crown only. Rinse gently in milk or saline. Reinsert into the socket immediately if possible; if not, store in milk, saline, or between cheek and gum. Replantation within 30 minutes gives an 85–97% success rate; beyond 60 minutes, success drops significantly. Call 13 13 16 straight away.

**\*\*Dental abscess:\*\*** A collection of infection at the tooth root or gum. Presents as severe throbbing pain, swelling, and sometimes fever. Call the clinic immediately. If you experience difficulty breathing, severe facial swelling affecting the throat, or fever above 38.5°C, call 000 — this may indicate spreading infection requiring hospital management.

**\*\*Chipped or broken tooth:\*\*** Collect any large fragments and store in milk. The severity determines urgency; a sharp edge causing soft tissue injury or exposure of the nerve needs same-day care.

**\*\*Lost filling or crown:\*\*** Usually not immediately dangerous, but can be sensitive. Temporary over-the-counter dental cement can protect the tooth until an appointment is available. Let the clinic know when you call.

---

### ## Children's dentistry and the Tooth Fairy Centre

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic is part of the Tooth Fairy Centre programme — Core Dental Group's specially designed children's dental experience. The idea behind it is straightforward: the way a child experiences their first dental visits shapes their relationship with dental care for life. Positive early experiences create cooperative, confident dental patients; negative ones create avoidance that compounds into serious untreated disease.

The Australian Dental Association recommends a child's first dental visit within six months of the first tooth erupting, or by the child's first birthday — whichever comes first. Core Dental Group uses the tell-show-do technique for all paediatric first visits: explaining what will happen, demonstrating with a

model or mirror, then gently carrying out the procedure. This graduated exposure approach is backed by a strong body of paediatric dental psychology research as the most effective non-pharmacological anxiety management technique.

### ### The Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS)

For eligible families, the CDBS represents meaningful annual savings. The current benefit cap is \$1,158 per eligible child over two calendar years, covering:

- Dental examinations - X-rays - Cleans (scale and polish) - Fissure sealants - Fillings - Extractions - Root canal treatment on baby teeth

Eligibility is automatic for families receiving Family Tax Benefit Part A, Parenting Payment, or Youth Allowance. There's no application process — Medicare notifies eligible families via post or myGov. Eligibility can also be checked at reception when booking.

The CDBS does not cover orthodontic treatment, teeth whitening, or cosmetic procedures. Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic is a registered CDBS provider.

Around 1 in 3 eligible children historically uses the CDBS — meaning most entitled families leave benefits unused. If your child is eligible, using the CDBS for two annual check-ups plus a fissure sealant application at age six to seven delivers interventions worth substantially more than their cost.

### ### Managing dental anxiety in children

Around 16% of Australian adults report high dental anxiety, and research shows dental fear is typically established in childhood. The clinic's paediatric approach is designed specifically to prevent anxiety from developing. In addition to tell-show-do behavioural guidance, Core Dental Carrum Downs offers nitrous oxide (happy gas) sedation for children who need extra support. Nitrous oxide is safe, titratable in real time, non-metabolised by the body, and wears off quickly after the mask is removed.

For children with significant dental anxiety, developmental considerations, or complex treatment needs, referral to the visiting paediatric dental specialist through the CSSC programme is available.

---

### ## Cosmetic dentistry: evidence-based aesthetic treatments

Cosmetic dentistry at Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic is grounded in clinical evidence, not just aesthetics. Every cosmetic treatment improves function alongside appearance, and every recommendation draws on published survival and satisfaction data.

#### ### Porcelain and composite veneers

Dental veneers are thin shells of porcelain or composite resin bonded to the front surface of teeth to correct shape, colour, size, or spacing. They're among the most transformative cosmetic treatments available.

Porcelain veneers have a published 10-year survival rate of approximately 95.5% — better than most other cosmetic restorations. They're stain-resistant, highly durable, and produce the most natural-looking result for comprehensive smile makeovers. Preparation involves removing a thin layer of enamel (typically 0.3–0.5 mm), making the treatment largely irreversible. Preparation-free or minimal-prep veneers preserve enamel entirely for appropriate cases.

Composite veneers are sculpted directly onto the tooth surface in a single appointment using tooth-coloured composite resin. They require little to no enamel removal and are reversible. Survival at 5–7 years is solid for a well-maintained composite veneer; they're more prone to staining and chipping than porcelain but offer a faster, more affordable starting point.

### ### Professional teeth whitening

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic offers both in-chair whitening and take-home whitening systems. In-chair whitening can achieve up to 8–10 shade changes in a single 60-minute appointment using a high-concentration peroxide gel (35–40% hydrogen peroxide). Take-home whitening uses custom-fitted trays with a lower-concentration gel (6–16% hydrogen peroxide), applied for 30–60 minutes daily over 10–14 days.

Current meta-analyses confirm that light activation (UV/LED lamps) doesn't improve whitening outcomes beyond the effect of the peroxide gel itself — the results are gel-driven. Both in-chair and take-home protocols produce equivalent final results; in-chair whitening just gets there faster.

### ### Composite bonding and smile design

Direct composite bonding repairs chips, closes small gaps (diastemas), reshapes irregular teeth, and masks minor discolouration. It's completed in a single appointment, is fully reversible, and is the most cost-effective entry point to cosmetic improvement. For patients with multiple teeth needing attention, a digital smile design consultation — using intraoral scanning and software to preview proposed changes before any treatment begins — is available at Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic.

### ## Invisalign and orthodontics: Blue Diamond provider in south-east Melbourne

Core Dental Group is a Blue Diamond Invisalign Provider — the highest tier awarded by Align Technology. This status can't be purchased; it's earned solely by completing more than 750 Invisalign cases per calendar year. For patients in Carrum Downs seeking Invisalign treatment, Blue Diamond status means working with clinicians who have real depth of experience across the full clinical spectrum, from straightforward adult mild crowding to complex arch development cases.

### ### How Invisalign works

Invisalign treatment uses a series of custom-fabricated clear aligner trays, each worn for roughly one to two weeks, to progressively move teeth into their prescribed positions. The trays are virtually invisible, removable for eating and cleaning, and — for many patients — noticeably more comfortable than fixed braces.

Treatment planning starts with an iTero intraoral scan (no physical impressions needed) and a digital treatment simulation, so patients can preview their projected outcome before committing. The scan produces a ClinCheck® plan reviewed and refined by the treating clinician and Align Technology.

Invisalign treatment ranges in cost from approximately \$3,500 to \$9,000 in Australia depending on case complexity. Core Dental Group offers a price-match guarantee against any personalised written specialist treatment plan.

### ### Traditional braces: metal, ceramic, and lingual options

For cases where fixed appliances are clinically preferable — particularly in younger patients where treatment compliance is a consideration — Core Dental Group offers metal brackets (the most durable and cost-effective option), ceramic brackets (tooth-coloured, less visible), and lingual braces (positioned behind the teeth, completely invisible from the front).

### ### Orthodontics and the CDBS

Orthodontic treatment is explicitly excluded from the Child Dental Benefits Schedule. Families seeking help with orthodontic costs can access Payright interest-free payment plans up to \$20,000 over 30 months.

## ## Dental implants: the gold standard tooth replacement

A dental implant is a titanium post inserted into the jawbone that integrates with the bone (osseointegration) over 3–6 months, then supports a ceramic crown that looks and functions like a natural tooth. The five-year survival rate for dental implants is 95–98% in appropriate candidates; at 20 years, around 80% of implants are still functional.

### ### Why timing of implant placement matters

The jawbone immediately surrounding a lost tooth begins resorbing as soon as the tooth is removed. Research shows 29–63% of horizontal bone width is lost in the first six months post-extraction, with ongoing vertical loss after that. This bone loss can create the need for bone grafting before an implant can be placed — a procedure that adds cost and treatment time.

For appropriate candidates, Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic offers immediate implant placement at the time of extraction, reducing total treatment time and preserving bone where clinically safe.

### ### Implant-supported dentures and full-arch rehabilitation

For patients with multiple missing teeth or complete arch rehabilitation needs, implant-supported prosthetics (including All-on-4 and All-on-6 protocols) provide fixed, non-removable tooth replacement using fewer implants than conventional full-arch approaches. This makes full-mouth rehabilitation accessible to patients who might otherwise rely on conventional dentures — which provide no bone preservation benefit and typically need replacing every 5–10 years.

## ## Periodontics and gum disease: Australia's most underdiagnosed dental condition

Around 30% of Australian adults have moderate or severe periodontitis, yet most are unaware of their condition. Periodontal disease — infection and inflammation of the gum and bone supporting the teeth — is the leading cause of tooth loss in adults and is directly linked to systemic health through multiple biological mechanisms.

The connection to cardiovascular disease is well established: meta-analyses confirm that individuals with periodontitis have a 19–28% higher risk of cardiovascular events than those without. The link to type 2 diabetes is bidirectional — poor glycaemic control worsens periodontal disease, and active periodontal inflammation worsens glycaemic control. Treating gum disease can reduce HbA1c by 0.43% on average — a meaningful clinical improvement.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic screens every patient for periodontal disease at every visit using calibrated probing. Identified periodontal disease is managed through non-surgical deep cleaning (scaling and root planing), supportive periodontal therapy (regular maintenance at 3–4 month intervals for active disease, 6–12 months for stable patients), and specialist referral when surgical intervention is required.

## ## Root canal treatment: saving teeth that others would extract

Root canal treatment (endodontic therapy) removes infected or necrotic pulp tissue from inside the tooth, disinfects the root canal system, and seals it to prevent re-infection. It allows a tooth that would otherwise be extracted to stay in function for decades.

The evidence on outcomes is strong: around 96% of patients who have had root canal treatment say they would have the procedure again. The 10-year survival rate for root canal treated teeth is approximately 97% when the tooth is protected with a crown post-treatment.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic uses rubber dam isolation for all root canal procedures — the gold-standard infection control protocol. For complex cases (calcified canals, curved roots, retreatment of previous endodontic therapy), referral to the visiting specialist endodontist through the CSSC model is available.

Wisdom teeth (third molars) are the most commonly extracted teeth in Australia — around 30.9% of all dental extractions involve them. Common reasons for extraction include impaction (the tooth is unable to fully erupt), recurrent pericoronitis (gum infection around a partially erupted tooth), crowding, and decay in a hard-to-reach position.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic performs routine and surgical wisdom tooth extractions under local anaesthetic, with nitrous oxide sedation available for anxious patients. For cases involving deeply impacted teeth adjacent to the inferior alveolar nerve, referral to the oral and maxillofacial surgeon through the CSSC is available — providing specialist-level care without the need for hospital-based extraction in most cases.

---

#### ## Specialist care through the Core Specialist Support Centre (CSSC)

One of Core Dental Group's most clinically significant features is the CSSC model. Rather than asking patients to navigate an independent referral to a specialist practice in the CBD, the CSSC programme brings AHPRA-registered specialists to the local clinic.

Available specialist disciplines through the CSSC include:

**\*\*Periodontist\*\*** — specialist in gum disease, bone loss, and implant-related soft tissue management.

**\*\*Endodontist\*\*** — specialist in root canal treatment, particularly complex or retreatment cases.

**\*\*Oral and maxillofacial surgeon\*\*** — surgical extractions, bone grafting, implant placement, and jaw surgery.

**\*\*Prosthodontist\*\*** — specialist in complex restorations, full-arch implant rehabilitation, and crown and bridge work.

**\*\*Paediatric dental specialist (paedodontist)\*\*** — specialist management of children with significant anxiety, complex treatment needs, or developmental conditions.

Having CSSC access means that even complex, multi-disciplinary treatment can be coordinated and largely delivered locally — removing the friction, travel time, and delays that come with CBD specialist referrals.

#### ## Sleep dentistry: dental care for anxious patients

Dental anxiety affects around 16% of Australians at a clinically significant level. It's consistently associated with poorer oral health outcomes — not because anxious patients have worse hygiene, but because anxiety reliably leads to appointment avoidance, which means deferred treatment and more serious disease when patients eventually present.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic offers two sedation levels for anxious patients.

**\*\*Nitrous oxide (happy gas)\*\*** is delivered via a small nasal mask. It produces a relaxed, mildly euphoric state while the patient remains fully conscious and responsive. It's titratable in real time, wears off within minutes of mask removal, and allows patients to drive home after clinical assessment. It suits mild to moderate anxiety well.

**\*\*IV sedation (twilight sedation)\*\*** is administered intravenously by a qualified sedation provider. It produces a deeply relaxed, amnesic state — most patients have little or no memory of the procedure. Recovery requires a responsible adult escort and a 24-hour period of no driving. It's appropriate for high anxiety, needle phobia, or longer treatment sessions.

Both options are available for adult and paediatric patients at Core Dental Group, and both can be discussed at the pre-treatment consultation.

## ## Advanced technology at Core Dental Carrum Downs

### ### Digital radiography

All X-rays at Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic use digital radiography, which produces 50–80% less radiation than conventional film X-rays while delivering superior diagnostic image quality. Digital sensors provide immediate on-screen images that can be magnified, enhanced, and annotated.

### ### CBCT (cone beam CT) imaging

CBCT 3D imaging produces detailed volumetric scans of the jaws and teeth, used primarily for implant planning (assessing bone volume and anatomy, identifying nerve locations), orthodontic diagnosis, and complex surgical planning. This removes the need for a separate radiology referral for most implant and surgical planning needs.

### ### CEREC same-day crowns

CEREC (Chairside Economical Restoration of Esthetic Ceramics) uses digital impressions and chairside milling to produce a porcelain crown in a single appointment. There's no temporary crown, no second appointment — the crown is designed, milled, and fitted on the day, typically in 30–90 minutes.

### ### iTero digital impressions

The iTero intraoral scanner replaces the traditional impression tray and alginate material with a comfortable digital scan. The scan is used for Invisalign treatment planning (ClinCheck®), digital denture fabrication, and restorative treatment planning. It removes the gag reflex issue, improves patient comfort, and produces a more accurate digital model.

### ### Private health insurance and HICAPS

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic accepts all major private health funds. Benefits are processed via HICAPS at point of service — meaning you pay only the out-of-pocket gap, not the full fee upfront. ## ## The oral-systemic health connection: why your teeth matter beyond your mouth

For many patients, dental care sits in a separate mental category from general health. The clinical evidence doesn't support that separation. The links between oral disease and systemic conditions are well established, bidirectional, and mechanistically understood.

### ### Periodontal disease and cardiovascular health

The oral cavity is one of the most heavily colonised microbial environments in the human body, hosting around 700 distinct bacterial species. In health, this community sits in stable equilibrium; in periodontitis, pathogenic anaerobes dominate and trigger a sustained inflammatory response. That local inflammatory state doesn't stay local.

A 2022 meta-analysis published in *\*Cardiovascular Research\** (Leng et al.) confirmed that individuals with periodontitis have a 19–28% higher risk of cardiovascular events compared to those without. The biological mechanism involves bacteraemia (oral pathogens entering the bloodstream through inflamed

gum tissue), elevated systemic inflammatory markers including C-reactive protein and interleukin-6, and direct atherogenic potential of certain periodontal pathogens such as \*Porphyromonas gingivalis\*.

For Frankston corridor patients managing or at risk of cardiovascular disease, keeping periodontal disease under active management at Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic is directly relevant to their cardiological risk profile.

### ### Periodontal disease and diabetes

The relationship between diabetes and periodontal disease is bidirectional: poor glycaemic control worsens periodontal disease, and active periodontal inflammation worsens glycaemic control by impairing insulin receptor sensitivity. A 2024 meta-analysis published in \*Frontiers in Cardiovascular Medicine\* confirmed that treatment of periodontal disease improved glycaemic control in type 2 diabetic patients by a mean reduction of 0.43% in HbA1c — a clinically meaningful improvement. For reference, many oral hypoglycaemic medications aim for a 0.5–1.0% HbA1c reduction as a primary endpoint.

### ### Periodontal disease and pregnancy outcomes

Pregnant patients with active periodontitis have shown increased risk of preterm birth and low birth weight in multiple meta-analyses. The mechanism involves periodontal pathogens and inflammatory mediators crossing the placental barrier and triggering early uterine contractions. The Australian Dental Association and professional obstetric guidelines recommend that pregnant patients maintain regular dental attendance during pregnancy, and that active periodontal disease be treated.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic supports pregnant patients with periodontal management, adjusted radiography protocols, and a clinical approach calibrated to the needs of each trimester.

## ## Dental implants: the complete clinical picture

### ### What actually happens during implant treatment

Understanding the implant process makes the timeline clearer and helps patients plan appropriately.

**\*\*Stage 1: Planning.\*\*** A CBCT scan maps the available bone volume and identifies critical structures (inferior alveolar nerve, sinus floor) that determine implant positioning. The treating clinician uses the scan data to select the appropriate implant diameter and length and to plan the precise insertion angle and depth.

**\*\*Stage 2: Placement.\*\*** The implant is placed under local anaesthetic. A small incision exposes the bone; the implant site is prepared using a series of drills at increasing diameter; the titanium implant is inserted and the gum closed over it. The procedure typically takes 30–90 minutes for a single implant. Nitrous oxide or IV sedation is available.

**\*\*Stage 3: Osseointegration.\*\*** The implant integrates with the surrounding bone over 3–6 months. During this period, the implant is not loaded — a temporary restoration (if aesthetically necessary) protects the site without functional pressure.

**\*\*Stage 4: Crown attachment.\*\*** Once integration is confirmed, an abutment is attached to the implant and a ceramic crown fabricated — either via CEREC chairside milling (single appointment) or dental laboratory fabrication. The crown is matched in colour and shape to the adjacent teeth.

**\*\*Stage 5: Maintenance.\*\*** Implants are maintained the same way as natural teeth: daily brushing and interdental cleaning, and regular professional scale and clean. The implant itself can't decay, but the surrounding gum and bone can develop peri-implantitis (an implant-specific form of inflammatory bone loss) if oral hygiene is inadequate.

### ### Bone grafting: when it's needed

If significant bone resorption has occurred since tooth loss — or if the bone anatomy isn't sufficient for implant placement — a bone graft may be required before or at the same time as implant placement. Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic performs simple bone grafting procedures; complex grafting cases involving the sinus or extensive defects are managed through the CSSC oral surgeon.

## ## The evidence on teeth whitening

### ### Professional versus over-the-counter whitening

The mechanism of dental whitening is straightforward: peroxide gel penetrates the enamel and oxidises chromogenic compounds within the tooth's organic matrix, producing a lighter colour. The concentration of peroxide determines how quickly this happens.

Over-the-counter whitening products in Australia are limited to 6% hydrogen peroxide or equivalent. Professionally applied in-chair gels typically use 25–40% hydrogen peroxide. Take-home custom-tray systems dispensed from a dental practice use 6–16% carbamide peroxide (releasing approximately 3–6% hydrogen peroxide over time), providing intermediate efficacy between OTC and in-chair options.

A 2024 systematic review published in *Bioengineering*\* (Butera et al., University of Pavia) found that all professional bleaching modalities are effective, with in-chair whitening producing the fastest results (up to 8–10 shade improvements in a single session) and take-home systems producing equivalent or superior final results over a longer treatment period.

### ### Managing sensitivity

Post-whitening sensitivity — typically a transient sensitivity to temperature and air — affects a proportion of patients. The mechanism involves peroxide penetrating dentinal tubules and stimulating intradental nerve fibres. Mitigation strategies include:

- Using desensitising toothpaste (potassium nitrate or stannous fluoride-based) for two weeks before treatment
- Applying fluoride varnish immediately post-treatment
- Allowing 48–72 hours between consecutive whitening sessions if using take-home trays
- Choosing a lower-concentration in-chair gel if pre-existing sensitivity is present

Newer phthalimidoperoxycaproic acid (PAP)-based whitening systems have shown equivalent whitening efficacy to peroxide-based systems with significantly lower sensitivity rates.

---

## ## TMJ disorders and teeth grinding: a common and underdiagnosed problem

Temporomandibular joint (TMJ) dysfunction and bruxism (teeth grinding) are among the most common conditions treated at Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic — and among the most frequently missed by patients themselves.

### ### The prevalence and consequences of bruxism

Around 8–16% of adults grind their teeth during sleep (sleep bruxism), with a smaller proportion grinding during waking hours (awake bruxism). The condition is more common during periods of high stress, anxiety, and sleep disruption. Untreated bruxism causes:

- **Tooth wear** — progressive loss of enamel and dentine that is irreversible. Heavy grinding can reduce a molar by 2–3 mm over a decade.
- **Tooth fracture** — vertical and cusp fractures are significantly more common in bruxers.
- **TMJ inflammation and dysfunction** — jaw pain, clicking, limited opening, and headaches.
- **Muscle hypertrophy** — the masseter and temporalis muscles enlarge with chronic overuse, sometimes producing a squared jaw appearance.

### ### Occlusal splint therapy

The primary management tool for bruxism is an occlusal splint — a custom-fitted acrylic appliance worn over the upper teeth during sleep. The splint absorbs grinding forces, reduces tooth wear, and unloads the TMJ. It doesn't stop grinding but prevents its consequences.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic fabricates custom occlusal splints using direct impressions or digital scans. Laboratory-fabricated splints provide superior fit and durability compared to over-the-counter boil-and-bite alternatives.

### ### Muscle relaxant injections for bruxism

For patients with significant masseter hypertrophy and associated TMJ or headache symptoms, muscle relaxant injections into the masseter can reduce grinding force and muscle bulk. Results typically last 3–6 months. This option is discussed at assessment for eligible patients.

---

### ## Oral surgery at Core Dental Carrum Downs

Beyond wisdom teeth removal, the oral surgery scope at Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic includes:

- Soft tissue procedures — frenectomy (removal of a lip or tongue tie), gingival biopsies for histopathological diagnosis
- Bone grafting — socket preservation after extraction to maintain bone volume for future implant placement
- Implant placement — as described in the implants section
- Incision and drainage — management of facial space infection secondary to dental abscess

For cases that go beyond the scope appropriate for the general clinical environment — particularly complex impactions, jaw pathology, or cases requiring general anaesthesia — CSSC specialist oral and maxillofacial surgeon referral is available.

The specialist comes to the patient's regular clinic, works within the existing clinical record, and coordinates treatment with the general dental team. This integration is clinically superior to fragmented referral pathways.

#### ### Group clinical protocols and quality standards

A group practice maintains standardised clinical protocols, equipment standards, and continuing professional development across the network. Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic operates under the same clinical governance framework as every other Core Dental Group location — meaning Frankston corridor patients benefit from the quality standards developed across a network serving

## ## Making the most of your private health insurance at Core Dental Carrum Downs

Private health insurance extras cover dental at different levels depending on your policy, fund, and coverage tier. Understanding your entitlements — and timing your use of them — is a practical financial skill worth developing.

### ### Understanding benefit levels

Private health funds categorise dental services into:

- **General dental** (Tier 1/basic): Examinations, X-rays, cleans, simple fillings, simple extractions. Covered by most basic extras policies. - **Major dental** (Tier 2): Crowns, bridges, dentures, complex fillings, surgical extractions. Typically requires mid- or high-tier extras. - **Orthodontics** (Tier 3): Braces and Invisalign. Usually requires a specific orthodontic benefit within an extras policy, and has a separate lifetime cap (typically \$2,000–\$3,500 per person).

### ### Annual limits, waiting periods, and the December deadline

Most extras policies have an annual benefit cap that resets on 1 January. Benefits don't carry over — any unused entitlement expires at year end. For families with multiple children, the October–December period is particularly useful for catching up on preventive appointments, fissure sealants, and X-rays before entitlements reset.

Waiting periods apply to new extras policies: typically 2 months for general dental, 12 months for major dental and orthodontics. Starting a new policy ahead of a planned major treatment avoids delays.

Core Dental Group's Carrum Downs clinic processes all major private health fund claims via HICAPS at point of service — you pay only the gap, not the full fee, at the time of treatment.
