The practical differences are largely lifestyle-related: Invisalign has no dietary restrictions, easier oral hygiene, and near-invisibility, while braces require dietary modifications, more involved cleaning routines, and are visually obvious.

2. Traditional metal braces

Metal braces have been a trusted orthodontic method for decades, effectively treating nearly all types of alignment problems. They use metal brackets and wires to guide teeth gradually into the correct position.

Metal braces are the most clinically versatile option. For complex cases — severe crowding, significant bite correction including deep overbite, open bite, or crossbite, or cases requiring tooth extraction and precise root movement — traditional braces are the more predictable choice.

A key practical advantage: they don't rely on patient compliance. You can't take them out and forget to wear them.

3. Clear (ceramic) braces

Ceramic braces work the same way as metal braces but use clear or tooth-coloured ceramic brackets, often paired with tooth-coloured wires, for a less obvious appearance. They're bonded to the front of the teeth — the same position as metal braces — but are considerably less visible in social and professional settings.

Ceramic braces are the same size and shape as metal braces, just with clear brackets that blend into the teeth. Appointments follow the same schedule as traditional metal braces, every 4–8 weeks, but the aesthetic result is noticeably more discreet.

Ceramic braces are popular among adult patients who need the biomechanical reliability of fixed appliances but want a more aesthetic presentation than metal.

4. Internal (lingual) braces

Lingual braces are attached to the inside of the teeth, making them invisible from the front. They're the same shape and size as traditional metal braces, just placed on the inner surface.

Lingual braces cost more than traditional braces because they're an entirely custom solution, made in a dental laboratory to fit your teeth precisely. Treatment also requires more frequent appointments and longer appointment times than regular braces, which contributes to the higher cost.

This option suits professionals and performers for whom even the subtle visibility of ceramic braces is unacceptable.

Treatment duration

Invisalign is typically faster for simple cases (6 to 12 months versus 12 to 18 months for braces) but comparable, or slightly longer, for complex cases.

Cost in Australia

Invisalign typically ranges from \$3,500 to \$9,000 AUD. Traditional metal braces generally run \$6,000 to \$9,000 AUD. A 2025 systematic review published in **BMC Oral Health** examined clear aligner outcomes across adolescent and adult patients and found that treatment success is primarily determined by patient compliance, treatment planning, and case complexity management. That finding matters: the experience level of your provider, not just the technology, drives outcomes.

Orthodontics for teens: what Wyndham parents need to know

Adolescent orthodontics carries unique considerations that differ from adult treatment. Compliance, growth patterns, and social confidence all play a role in treatment selection.

****Invisalign Teen**** was designed to address the compliance challenge. It costs approximately \$5,000–\$8,000 AUD, with a treatment duration of 12–18 months. For teens with complex bite issues or severe crowding, traditional metal braces may remain the most clinically appropriate choice.
