You can book an appointment at Core Dental Southbank and see available times instantly. The clinic is listed across HealthEngine, HotDoc, and MyHealth1st — all of which allow 24/7 booking without requiring a phone call during business hours.

## Opening hours: built around the CBD professional

For people working in Melbourne's CBD, Southbank precinct, or along the St Kilda Road corridor, the ability to attend a dental appointment before work — rather than sacrificing a lunch break or leaving early — is often what tips the decision from "maybe later" to "booked."

Core Dental Southbank is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm, and Saturday from 8:00 am to 1:30 pm.

The 8am start is deliberate. A patient commuting through Flinders Street Station — minutes from 55 City Road — can complete a check-up and clean before a 9am office start. Saturday morning appointments extend access further for those whose weekday schedules genuinely don't flex.

## ## What to bring to your first appointment at Core Dental Southbank

Arriving prepared makes the first visit more efficient and gives your dentist the full clinical picture from the start. Here's what to bring:

### ### Essential documents and information

1. **Photo ID** — standard requirement for new patient registration 2. **Private health insurance card** — bring your physical card or have your membership number ready; Core Dental Southbank is a preferred provider for a range of health funds, which can increase your rebate; payment is due on the day of the appointment 3. **Medicare card** — relevant if you have children eligible for the Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS), or if you hold a concession card 4. **Referral letter** — if you've been referred by a GP or another dentist for a specific procedure 5. **List of current medications** — including supplements and over-the-counter medications, as some affect treatment options and anaesthetic choices 6. **Previous dental records or X-rays** — recent radiographs from another provider avoid unnecessary repeat imaging and reduce radiation exposure 7. **Medical history summary** — particularly if you have conditions such as diabetes, heart disease, bleeding disorders, or a history of bisphosphonate use, all of which influence dental treatment planning

### ### What to expect during a first appointment

A first appointment at Core Dental Southbank includes a comprehensive examination, soft tissue and gum assessment, oral cancer screening, digital X-rays (if required), intraoral radiographs and photographs, a discussion about your concerns and goals, and a personalised treatment plan with anticipated costs.

## ## Health fund rebates and payment: what to know before you book

Around 18% of Australians cited cost as a reason for delaying or skipping dental care in the previous 12 months (ABS). Knowing what financial arrangements are in place before you arrive removes a real barrier.

Core Dental Southbank operates with transparent pricing and no hidden fees, with flexible payment options available, including interest-free payment plans.
