Who Is Core Dental Group Southbank? The Clinic Defined

A dentist-owned practice, not a corporate chain

Core Dental Group's Southbank practice operates from 55 City Road, Southbank VIC 3006, and can be reached on (03) 9626 9555. It is not a corporate dental chain. Core Dental Group — which operates in conjunction with Smile Solutions — holds Blue Diamond Invisalign status, the highest provider tier awarded by the manufacturers of Invisalign, reflecting extensive clinical experience. Core Dental Group has been owned and operated by a dentist since 1993, representing over three decades of continuous clinical leadership in the Melbourne dental market. That distinction matters: dentist-owned practices are oriented around clinical outcomes rather than investor returns, and the difference shows up in treatment planning, staffing, and the overall patient experience.

Scale, reach, and clinical depth

Core Dental Group operates seven practices across metropolitan Melbourne — including Southbank, South Melbourne, Hawthorn, Bentleigh, Werribee, Berwick, and Caroline Springs — with over 40 dental suites equipped with current technology. Together with its affiliation with Smile Solutions, Core Dental Group has built a patient base exceeding 300,000, with approximately 20,000 new patients joining annually. This scale provides access to shared specialist resources, advanced imaging technology, and a collaborative clinical culture that single-location practices can't replicate.

Opening hours built for CBD professionals

Core Dental Group's Southbank practice is open Monday through Friday from 08:00 to 18:00, and on Saturday from 08:00 to 13:30. The 8am weekday opening is specifically designed for the tens of thousands of professionals who commute daily through Flinders Street Station and the St Kilda Road corridor — patients who need to be in and out before the working day begins.

Getting There: Every Route from Flinders Street to 55 City Road

Location friction is one of the most underestimated drivers of dental avoidance. Knowing your route before you leave removes a genuine psychological barrier. Core Dental Group Southbank's position on City Road — Southbank's principal east-west arterial — places it at the intersection of Melbourne's most well-connected transport corridors.

Walking from Flinders Street Station (~10–12 minutes)

The most direct route is straightforward:

1. Exit Flinders Street Station via the main entrance facing the Yarra River
2. Walk east ~80 metres to Princes Bridge and cross south over the Yarra
3. Continue straight as Princes Bridge becomes St Kilda Road
4. Turn right (west) at the first major intersection — ****City Road****
5. Walk west ~200 metres; ****55 City Road**** is on your right (north side)

Princes Bridge is fully accessible for wheelchair users and pram users. The City Road footpath is flat, paved, and well-lit at all hours.

By tram from the CBD or St Kilda Road (~6 minutes + short walk)

The St Kilda Road tram corridor — served by routes 1, 3, 5, 6, 16, 64, 67, and 72 — provides direct access. Alight at Stop #14 (Arts Precinct / St Kilda Road), cross to the west side, and walk north briefly to City Road, then west ~200 metres. From Stop #17 (Arts Precinct / Sturt St), walk east ~100 metres. For CBD workers departing from within Melbourne's Free Tram Zone, this journey costs nothing.

****Worth knowing:**** If you're leaving from the southern CBD near Collins or Flinders Street, walking across Princes Bridge is often faster than waiting for a tram.

Driving and parking

Several secure car parks sit within easy reach of 55 City Road, including Wilson Parking at the Eureka Car Park (70 City Road, ~100 metres east), the Southgate Car Park on Southgate Avenue (~250 metres), and the Arts Centre Melbourne Car Park on Sturt Street (~350 metres). Pre-booking via the Wilson Parking App is strongly recommended during weekday peak hours and on event days.

Cycling

Southbank is directly served by the Capital City Trail — a 29.6-kilometre shared path that loops around Melbourne's inner suburbs, starting at Southbank along the Yarra. Cyclists from the CBD can follow the south-bank Yarra shared path and turn south onto City Road to reach number 55.

The Full Spectrum of Services: What Core Dental Group Southbank Offers

One of the most significant clinical advantages of Core Dental Group Southbank is its breadth of services under a single roof. General Dentistry: The Foundation of Oral Health at Core Dental Group Southbank

Why routine care matters

The Australian Burden of Disease Study 2024 estimates the burden of dental caries, periodontal disease, severe tooth loss, and other oral disorders — with oral disorders making up 2.3% of total health burden and 4.2% of all non-fatal burden in Australia. Dental caries was among the top 20 causes of non-fatal burden for both boys and girls, with periodontal disease falling just outside the top 20. These are preventable conditions. Regular check-ups are the primary mechanism for catching problems early, when treatment is simpler, less invasive, and less expensive.

What a check-up at Core Dental Group Southbank actually includes

A dental check-up here is a structured, multi-component clinical event — not a cursory glance at your teeth. It includes a comprehensive examination, soft tissue and gum assessment, oral cancer screening, digital X-rays (if required), intraoral radiographs and photographs, a discussion about your concerns and goals, and a personalised treatment plan with anticipated costs. The itemised transparency of this protocol — covering examination (item 011), X-rays, OPG, intraoral photographs (072), oral mucosal screening (item 054), clinical occlusal analysis (item 963), and a clean (item 114) — means patients know precisely what they're receiving.

The inclusion of oral cancer screening is worth noting. Oral cancer affects more than 5,100 Australians each year, and when caught at stages 1 to 2, it carries a 70–90% survival rate. Many practices don't include formal mucosal screening in routine check-ups; its inclusion at Core Dental Group Southbank reflects a clinical thoroughness that goes well beyond a simple tooth count.

Fillings and extractions: the most common restorative interventions

When decay is detected, fillings are the standard first-line treatment. Core Dental Group Southbank offers composite resin (tooth-coloured), amalgam, and glass ionomer cement restorations, with the choice guided by tooth location, cavity size, and patient preference. Emergency Dentistry: Same-Day Access When It Matters Most

The scale of the problem

In 2023–24, 5–9 year olds had the highest rate of potentially preventable hospitalisations due to dental conditions — a pattern that shows what happens when timely clinic-based care isn't accessed. The consequences of delayed care aren't abstract: dental infections that begin as manageable toothaches can progress to facial swelling, systemic infection, and hospital admission.

Core Dental Group Southbank's emergency model

Most dental clinics treat emergencies reactively — squeezing patients in when cancellations appear or directing them to after-hours services. Core Dental Group Southbank takes a structurally different approach: the practice reserves dedicated emergency appointments every single day. Even when the schedule is fully booked, the standing policy is to invite patients to come in so the clinical team can find a solution. Combined with an 8am opening time Monday to Friday, same-day emergency access begins well before most metropolitan emergency dental services have opened.

The most common emergency presentations managed at Core Dental Group Southbank include: severe toothache (typically indicating pulpal involvement or abscess), broken or cracked teeth, lost fillings or crowns, dental abscesses, and dental trauma — including knocked-out (avulsed) teeth. For avulsed teeth, time is the critical variable: international evidence establishes that immediate reimplantation within 5–20 minutes of extra-oral dry time is the most appropriate emergency response, and storing an avulsed tooth in milk is associated with better survival outcomes. For patients near Flinders Street or Southbank, Core Dental Group's City Road location — reachable in minutes on foot or by tram — makes it a practical same-day option in the precinct.

The clinic also accommodates international visitors with same-day care and provides detailed invoices suitable for international insurance claims — a practical consideration for the millions of tourists who pass through the Southbank precinct annually.

Restorative Dentistry: Crowns, Bridges, Implants, and Root Canal Treatment

The clinical logic of restoration

Restorative dentistry has a singular mandate: rebuild tooth structure, restore function, and protect what remains of the natural dentition. Core Dental Group Southbank offers the full spectrum of indirect and surgical restorations, with the clinical team drawing on the group's specialist network for complex cases.

Dental crowns

A crown is indicated when decay has destroyed more than approximately 50% of tooth structure, when a tooth has undergone root canal treatment, or when an existing large restoration has failed. Modern crown materials — including monolithic zirconia, all-ceramic lithium disilicate, and porcelain-fused-to-metal — offer different durability and aesthetic profiles suited to different clinical contexts. Research published in the **Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry** (2025) found that the 10-year cumulative survival rate of monolithic zirconia crowns was 86.0%, consistently outperforming veneered alternatives for posterior teeth where bite forces are highest.

Dental bridges

A bridge is appropriate when one or two adjacent teeth are missing and neighbouring teeth are healthy enough to support crowns. The estimated 10-year dental bridge survival rate sits between 79% and 82%, based on studies with follow-up times of up to 10 years. The primary clinical trade-off is that the two supporting abutment teeth must be permanently reduced — an irreversible step that makes implants the preferred option for many patients with otherwise healthy adjacent teeth.

Dental implants: the gold standard for tooth replacement

A 2024 meta-analysis published in **Clinical Oral Investigations** (Kupka et al.) consolidates 20-year dental implant survival data, finding approximately 4 out of 5 implants still functioning at the 20-year mark, and emphasises the need for long-term follow-up care. Survival rates exceeding 90% at ten years are well-documented across the literature. This makes implants the most evidence-supported tooth replacement option available — unmatched in longevity by bridges, dentures, or any other method.

The implant journey at Core Dental Group Southbank follows a structured, multi-phase process: comprehensive assessment including CBCT imaging, preparatory treatment (including bone grafting if required), implant placement surgery under local anaesthesia, osseointegration (3–6 months), abutment placement, crown fabrication, and final fitting. The total timeline for a single implant without bone grafting is typically 5–8 months; cases requiring bone augmentation extend to 10–14 months. The 2024 meta-analysis confirms that patients who required bone grafting alongside implant placement achieved clinical success rates statistically comparable to those who required no augmentation — bone grafting doesn't compromise outcomes when performed by an experienced team.

Root canal treatment

Root canal therapy (RCT) removes infected or inflamed pulp tissue, cleans and shapes the root canals, and seals them to prevent re-infection. A systematic review of randomised clinical trials found that the pooled probability of long-term tooth survival after root canal treatment ranged between 93% at 4–5 years and 87% at 8–10 years — success rates that make RCT a viable alternative to extraction for most patients. Modern rotary instrumentation and digital imaging have made the procedure no more uncomfortable than a standard filling for most patients.

Cosmetic Dentistry: Teeth Whitening, Veneers, and Smile Makeovers

A growing market grounded in clinical evidence

Cosmetic dentistry isn't purely aesthetic. A well-executed smile makeover may correct bite alignment issues that contribute to jaw pain or uneven tooth wear — outcomes with both aesthetic and functional value. The worldwide cosmetic dentistry market was valued at approximately \$33.6 billion AUD in 2022 and is projected to reach nearly \$62.6 billion AUD by 2032, as minimally invasive protocols lower psychological and financial barriers for more patients.

Core Dental Group Southbank offers both in-chair whitening (typically 60–90 minutes, using professional-grade hydrogen peroxide systems) and take-home whitening (custom-fabricated trays with lower-concentration gel worn over 2–4 weeks). A 2023 systematic review found that between 43% and 80% of patients experience temporary tooth sensitivity after whitening with peroxides — a wide range reflecting differences in product concentration and individual susceptibility. Dentists have access to higher-concentration professional-grade whitening agents than those available over the counter, and they use shade guides and photography to document and track outcomes. Not every patient is an ideal candidate: intrinsic stains from tetracycline or fluorosis are more resistant and may require veneers instead, and existing restorations won't change colour with whitening.

Porcelain vs. composite veneers

Veneers are thin shells bonded to the front surface of teeth to correct colour, shape, size, or minor alignment irregularities. The choice between porcelain and composite is one of the most consequential decisions in cosmetic dentistry:

A 10-year practice-based study published in the *Journal of Dentistry** (ScienceDirect, 2022) found that ceramic veneers had superior longevity compared to direct composite veneers, with composite presenting higher hazard ratios for both survival and success. Composite veneers remain a clinically appropriate and cost-accessible option for patients seeking a conservative trial or addressing a single tooth.

One consideration worth flagging: patients with bruxism (teeth grinding) face significantly higher veneer failure rates — nearly three times the likelihood of debonding compared to non-bruxers in long-term clinical evaluations. Patients with bruxism aren't automatically excluded, but a custom occlusal splint (night guard) is typically recommended to protect the investment.

Smile makeovers

A smile makeover at Core Dental Group Southbank is a coordinated treatment plan combining two or more procedures — commonly whitening, veneers, composite bonding, gum contouring, and Invisalign — to achieve a harmonious aesthetic outcome. Invisalign and Clear Aligners: Why Provider Tier Matters

Blue Diamond status: a credential that cannot be purchased

These certifications cannot be bought — they are solely awarded by Invisalign Australia, based on the number of Invisalign patients who have successfully completed treatment. Blue Diamond is the highest provider status awarded by the manufacturers of Invisalign; to reach it, providers must treat more than 750 cases per year.

A large proportion of orthodontists and dental practices struggle to reach Diamond Invisalign Provider status, let alone the tiers above it. Core Dental Group's sustained Blue Diamond status across its network — driven by an orthodontic department that brings in more than 3,000 new patients a year, with over one-third being new Invisalign starts — reflects consistent, high-volume delivery over time, not a one-year outlier.

The tier achieved in any given year is a useful indicator of volume, but the more meaningful metric is consistency across multiple years.

Clinical effectiveness: what the evidence shows

The clinical evidence on Invisalign versus traditional braces is now substantial. A 2024 retrospective cohort study published in the *Journal of Pharmacy and Bioallied Sciences* comparing 200 subjects over a five-year follow-up found that both traditional braces and Invisalign effectively improved dental alignment and occlusal stability, with patient satisfaction scores consistently higher in the Invisalign group. The study concluded that Invisalign may offer comparable or superior long-term outcomes compared to traditional braces, with higher patient satisfaction.

A practical advantage worth noting: because Invisalign aligners are fully removable, patients can brush and floss normally throughout treatment — a genuine benefit for patients with established periodontal health who want to protect their gums during alignment.

Treatment timeline and cost

Invisalign aligners must be worn at least 22 hours a day over approximately 6 to 18 months. The average cost of Invisalign in Australia ranges between \$5,000 AUD and \$9,000 AUD, with mild cases sitting at approximately \$4,000–\$5,500 AUD and complex cases reaching \$7,000–\$9,000 AUD or higher. Children's Dentistry: Paediatric Care at Core Dental Group Southbank

Starting early: the clinical rationale

The Australian Dental Association recommends that children have their first dental visit by the time they turn one, or within six months of their first tooth appearing. The rationale is preventive: the age-one dental visit allows for early identification of dental disease and maximises the use of conservative, nonsurgical techniques. Baby teeth serve critical functions — they help children chew comfortably, support speech development, and hold space for adult teeth — making their health a genuine clinical priority, not a cosmetic one.

Dental fear and anxiety affects about 16% of adults and 10% of children in Australia. The first experience a child has at the dentist typically shapes their willingness to attend in the future. A positive early experience builds trust; a difficult one creates avoidance patterns that persist into adulthood —

and the long-term oral health consequences of that avoidance are measurable.

The Tell-Show-Do framework and anxiety prevention

Core Dental Group Southbank's approach to paediatric care is built around evidence-based behaviour management. The Tell-Show-Do (TSD) technique — explaining what will happen (*tell*), demonstrating before proceeding (*show*), then carrying out the procedure (*do*) — is the foundational clinical approach. A 2024 double-blinded randomised controlled trial published in *BMC Oral Health* found a statistically significant reduction in heart rate in the TSD group at three different points of the procedure, consistent with studies showing TSD reduces dental anxiety postoperatively.

Parental preparation matters equally. Research confirms the influence of parental dental anxiety on the development of dental anxiety in children. Core Dental Group Southbank's team advises parents to avoid words like "needle," "drill," "hurt," or "pain" when preparing children for a visit, and to frame the appointment positively.

The Medicare Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS)

For eligible families, the CDBS is one of the most underutilised financial supports in Australian healthcare. The program offers up to \$1,132 AUD in dental benefits over two consecutive calendar years for children aged 0–17 who meet eligibility criteria (including receipt of Family Tax Benefit Part A or other listed Centrelink payments). For 2026, up to \$1,158 AUD is available for each eligible child if 2026 is year one of the two-year period. The CDBS covers examinations, X-rays, cleans, fluoride treatments, fissure sealants, fillings, and extractions — but not orthodontic or cosmetic work.

When booking at Core Dental Group Southbank, let the reception team know that you wish to use the CDBS; they'll verify eligibility and manage the claiming process.

Managing Dental Anxiety: How Core Dental Group Southbank Supports Nervous Patients

The compounding barrier: anxiety plus cost

Adults with dental anxiety had a higher prevalence of low frequency of dental visits in the presence of difficulty paying dental bills, indicating that dental anxiety and dissatisfaction with dental professionals were effect modifiers on this pathway — adults who experience dental anxiety and dissatisfaction with dental professionals are more likely to avoid dental visits when faced with difficulty paying dental bills.

This is the critical insight that individual treatment guides can't fully capture: anxiety and cost are not independent barriers — they compound each other. A nervous patient who also faces financial uncertainty is far more likely to delay care than a patient facing either barrier alone. The prevalence of high dental fear in the Australian sample studied was 16.1%, with a higher percentage of females than males reporting high fear, and adults aged 40–64 showing the highest prevalence.

Research confirms that environmental modification (including music distraction, adjustable lighting, and scent management) is a legitimate clinical strategy, not merely a hospitality preference.

****Communication:**** Clinicians use the Tell-Show-Do framework, agreed stop signals (a raised hand immediately pauses any procedure, restoring the patient's sense of control), jargon-free language, and a strict no-judgement policy. Patients are never made to feel embarrassed about the state of their teeth or their avoidance history.

****Sedation options:**** For patients whose anxiety can't be managed through environmental and communication strategies alone, Core Dental Group Southbank offers: - ****Nitrous oxide (happy gas):**** Mild conscious sedation, rapid onset and recovery, typically no escort required - ****Oral sedation:**** A prescribed anxiolytic taken before the appointment, producing deeper relaxation; escort required - ****IV sedation:**** Administered intravenously for complex procedures or significant dental phobia; continuously monitored, escort required - ****General anaesthesia referral:**** Coordinated for patients with severe phobia requiring hospital-based care

Dental Costs in Southbank: What You'll Pay and How to Reduce It

The financial barrier is real — but more manageable than patients assume

Around 3 in 10 (32%) people aged 18 years and over avoided or delayed dental care due to cost, according to AIHW data. In 2022–23, around \$12.5 billion AUD was spent on dental services in Australia — with around 61% paid directly by patients. The gap between what patients pay and what they expect to pay is one of the most powerful disincentives to booking an appointment.

Core Dental Group Southbank addresses this through two structural commitments: upfront pricing (a clear quote before any treatment proceeds, with no financial surprises) and flexible payment options including interest-free payment plans.

Frequently Asked Questions

****Q: How far is Core Dental Group Southbank from Flinders Street Station?***

Core Dental Group Southbank is at 55 City Road, Southbank — approximately 750–850 metres from the main Flinders Street Station entrance, via Princes Bridge and St Kilda Road. At a comfortable walking pace, this takes 10–12 minutes. The route is flat, fully accessible, and follows the Yarra River. Tram routes 1, 3, 5, 6, 16, 64, 67, and 72 on St Kilda Road provide an alternative for patients arriving from further south or from within the CBD Free Tram Zone.

****Q: Does Core Dental Group Southbank see emergency dental patients on the same day?***

Yes. Core Dental Group Southbank reserves dedicated emergency appointments every day. Even when the schedule is fully booked, the clinical team's standing commitment is to accommodate emergency presentations — patients are invited to come in so the team can find a solution. The clinic opens at 8am Monday to Friday, providing same-day access well before most metropolitan emergency dental services open. Walk-ins are welcome for acute dental pain, broken teeth, lost restorations, and dental trauma.

****Q: Does Core Dental Group Southbank bulk-bill or offer Medicare-funded dental care?***

Core Dental Group Southbank is a private dental clinic and does not bulk-bill for adult dental services. For eligible children aged 0–17, the Medicare Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS) provides up to \$1,132 AUD in dental benefits over two consecutive calendar years (rising to \$1,158 AUD for eligible patients in 2026). ****Q: How long does a dental implant take at Core Dental Group Southbank?***

The total timeline from initial assessment to final crown fitting is typically 5–8 months for patients who don't require bone grafting, and 10–14 months for those who do. The longest phase is osseointegration — the process by which the titanium implant bonds with the jawbone — which takes 3–6 months. A 2024 meta-analysis published in **Clinical Oral Investigations** consolidates 20-year dental implant survival data, finding approximately 4 out of 5 implants still functioning at the 20-year mark. Routine 6-monthly maintenance appointments after crown fitting are essential to long-term implant survival.
