Fixed appliances temporarily interfere with periodontal health because they complicate oral hygiene. Because Invisalign aligners are fully removable, patients brush and floss normally throughout treatment — a meaningful advantage for anyone who wants to protect their gums during alignment.

Who is a suitable candidate for Invisalign?

A 2023 retrospective clinical cohort study published in *The Angle Orthodontist* (Alam et al.) examined treatment duration predictors across 116 Invisalign patients using digital scanning and deep learning tooth segmentation. The research confirmed that malocclusion severity and specific tooth movement types — particularly torque — are the primary drivers of treatment length.
