This additional training is particularly valuable for complex cases — significant crowding, bite discrepancies, cases involving jaw growth in adolescents, or cases where the treatment plan requires careful sequencing to achieve both aesthetic and functional goals.

At Core Dental Caroline Springs, straightforward Invisalign cases can be managed by the experienced general dental team, while more complex cases benefit from Dr Austin's specialist orthodontic expertise. This flexibility means patients receive the right level of care for their specific situation, without needing to travel to a separate specialist practice.

How Invisalign Works

Invisalign uses a series of custom-made, clear, removable aligners to gradually move teeth into their desired positions. Each aligner is slightly different from the last, applying controlled forces to specific teeth in a precise sequence determined by the treatment plan.

The Invisalign Process at Core Dental Caroline Springs

****Step 1: Initial Consultation****

Your Invisalign journey begins with a comprehensive consultation. Your dentist or Dr Austin will examine your teeth, gums, and bite, take digital scans of your teeth using the practice's intraoral scanner (no messy impressions), and discuss your concerns, goals, and expectations.

This initial assessment determines whether Invisalign is the right treatment for your case. While Invisalign can treat a wide range of orthodontic concerns, there are some situations where alternative approaches may be more appropriate. You will receive honest, evidence-based advice — not a sales pitch.

****Step 2: Digital Treatment Planning and Smile Preview****

If Invisalign is appropriate for your case, your digital scans are used to create a detailed 3D treatment plan. Using Invisalign's ClinCheck software, your clinician designs the precise movements each tooth will make, from its current position to its final position.

Core Dental Caroline Springs uses ****smile preview software**** that allows you to see a simulation of your expected result before you commit to treatment. This is not a guarantee — biology does not

always follow software predictions perfectly — but it provides a realistic visualisation of the likely outcome, which is invaluable for setting expectations and making an informed decision.

****Step 3: Custom Aligner Fabrication****

Once you approve the treatment plan, your custom aligners are fabricated using Invisalign's SmartTrack material — a proprietary thermoplastic that was specifically engineered for the Invisalign system. SmartTrack applies gentle, constant force to the teeth, improving comfort, fit, and the predictability of tooth movement compared to earlier aligner materials.

****Step 4: Wearing Your Aligners****

You will wear each set of aligners for one to two weeks (as directed by your clinician) before progressing to the next set. Aligners should be worn for 20–22 hours per day — removing them only for eating, drinking anything other than water, and brushing and flossing.

Each aligner moves your teeth incrementally. The movements are small — typically 0.25 to 0.3 millimetres per aligner — but they accumulate over the course of treatment to achieve significant changes.

****Step 5: Attachments and Auxiliaries****

Many Invisalign treatment plans involve the use of attachments — small, tooth-coloured composite bumps bonded to specific teeth. Attachments provide additional grip points for the aligners, enabling more precise and complex tooth movements such as rotations, extrusions, and root movements that the aligners alone cannot achieve.

Your clinician may also use elastics (small rubber bands) that connect between upper and lower aligners to correct bite discrepancies, or precision cuts in the aligners to accommodate elastic wear.

****Step 6: Progress Monitoring****

Throughout treatment, you will attend regular progress appointments — typically every six to eight weeks — for your clinician to assess tracking, ensure the teeth are moving as planned, and provide your next sets of aligners. Digital scanning at these appointments allows objective comparison between the planned movement and the actual movement.

If any teeth are not tracking as expected, your clinician can intervene early — adjusting the plan, refining the aligner sequence, or adding attachments — rather than discovering the discrepancy at the end of treatment.

****Step 7: Refinement****

Many Invisalign cases include a refinement phase. After the initial aligner sequence is complete, new scans are taken and additional aligners are fabricated to fine-tune the result. Refinement is a normal part of the process, not a sign that something has gone wrong. Biological variation in tooth response means that some teeth may need additional movement to reach their ideal position.

****Step 8: Retention****

When treatment is complete, retention is essential to prevent the teeth from shifting back toward their original positions. Teeth have a natural tendency to relapse, particularly in the first year after orthodontic treatment. Retention options include fixed retainers (thin wires bonded behind the front teeth) and removable Vivera retainers (made by Invisalign using the same precision manufacturing as the treatment aligners).

Your clinician will recommend a retention protocol based on your case. Most patients will need to wear retainers long-term — typically nightly — to maintain their result.

What Invisalign Can Treat

Invisalign is not limited to minor cosmetic alignment. Modern Invisalign technology can treat a comprehensive range of orthodontic concerns:

Crowding

When there is insufficient space in the jaw for all the teeth to align properly, teeth become crowded — overlapping, twisting, and sitting at irregular angles. Crowding is the most common orthodontic concern and is well-suited to Invisalign treatment. Treatment may involve expansion of the arch, interproximal reduction (IPR) — the gentle removal of a thin layer of enamel between teeth to create space — or, in more severe cases, extraction of premolar teeth.

Spacing

Gaps between teeth (diastema) can be caused by missing teeth, undersized teeth, or jaw-tooth size discrepancy. Invisalign closes gaps by moving teeth together, distributing the space evenly, or consolidating it for future restoration (such as an implant or bridge for a missing tooth).

Overbite (Deep Bite)

An overbite occurs when the upper front teeth overlap the lower front teeth excessively. Severe overbites can cause wear on the lower teeth, gum trauma, and jaw discomfort. Invisalign addresses overbite by intruding (pushing up) the front teeth, extruding (bringing down) the back teeth, or a combination of both.

Underbite

An underbite occurs when the lower front teeth sit in front of the upper front teeth. Mild to moderate skeletal underbites and dental underbites can be treated with Invisalign. Severe skeletal underbites may require a combined orthodontic-surgical approach, which Dr Austin can assess and coordinate.

Crossbite

A crossbite occurs when one or more upper teeth bite inside the lower teeth. Crossbites can be anterior (front teeth) or posterior (back teeth), and if left untreated, they can cause asymmetric jaw growth, tooth wear, and gum recession. Invisalign can correct many crossbites, particularly dental crossbites and mild skeletal crossbites.

Open Bite

An open bite occurs when the front teeth do not overlap at all — there is a visible gap between the upper and lower front teeth when the back teeth are biting together. Open bites can affect eating and speech. Invisalign can treat dental open bites and mild skeletal open bites through a combination of intrusion and extrusion movements.

Living with Invisalign: What Daily Life Looks Like

One of the most common questions about Invisalign is not about the clinical outcome — it is about the practical reality of wearing aligners every day for twelve to twenty-four months. Understanding what daily life with Invisalign actually looks like helps set realistic expectations.

Eating and Drinking

One of the great advantages of Invisalign over fixed braces is that there are no dietary restrictions. Because the aligners are removed for eating and drinking, you can eat everything you normally would

— including all the foods that are off-limits with traditional braces (hard, sticky, crunchy foods).

However, the discipline lies in removing the aligners before every meal or snack, brushing your teeth after eating, and reinserting the aligners. Drinking water with aligners in is fine. Drinking anything else — coffee, tea, juice, alcohol, soft drinks — should be done with aligners removed, as coloured or sugary drinks can stain the aligners or promote decay between the aligner and the tooth surface.

Many Invisalign patients find they snack less during treatment simply because of the inconvenience of removing and reinserting aligners for every snack. Some consider this an unexpected benefit.

Speech

Some patients notice a slight lisp or change in speech when they first begin wearing aligners. This is temporary and typically resolves within a few days as the tongue adapts to the presence of the aligners. Reading aloud or talking through the initial adjustment period accelerates adaptation.

Comfort

Each new set of aligners applies fresh force to the teeth, so there is typically some pressure or mild discomfort for the first day or two of each new aligner. This is a sign that the aligners are working — the teeth are responding to the applied force. The discomfort is generally mild and resolves within forty-eight hours. Over-the-counter pain relief is rarely needed but can be taken if desired.

Oral Hygiene

Oral hygiene during Invisalign treatment is actually easier than with fixed braces, because the aligners are removed for brushing and flossing. However, it is more demanding than pre-treatment hygiene, because teeth should be brushed after every meal before reinserting the aligners. Trapping food debris between the aligner and the tooth surface accelerates decay risk.

Carry a travel toothbrush and toothpaste. It becomes second nature within the first few weeks.

Social and Professional Life

Invisalign aligners are, for practical purposes, invisible in social and professional settings. Most people will not notice you are wearing them unless you tell them. This is one of the primary reasons adults choose Invisalign over traditional braces — there is no metalwork, no visible wires, and no self-consciousness about appearance during treatment.

Invisalign for Teens

Invisalign is an excellent option for teenagers, and Core Dental Caroline Springs is well-positioned to support teen treatment with both general dental expertise and specialist orthodontic oversight from Dr Austin.

premolar teeth, open bites with skeletal components, asymmetries, and cases involving missing teeth where space management is needed for future implants or bridges.

How Long Does Invisalign Take?

Treatment duration varies depending on the complexity of your case:

- **Mild cases** (minor crowding, small gaps): 6–12 months - **Moderate cases** (moderate crowding, bite correction): 12–18 months - **Complex cases** (severe crowding, significant bite discrepancies): 18–24 months or longer

These are estimates. Your clinician will provide a more precise timeline based on your individual treatment plan. Compliance with aligner wear (20–22 hours per day) is the single most important factor in keeping treatment on track.

Can I play sport with Invisalign? Yes. The aligners offer some degree of protection, though they are not a substitute for a proper mouthguard. For contact sports, remove your aligners and wear a custom-fitted mouthguard. Core Dental Caroline Springs can provide custom mouthguards during treatment.

Can I play a musical instrument with Invisalign? Yes. Wind and brass instrument players may notice a brief adaptation period, but most adjust quickly. Aligners are thin and smooth, and most musicians find they do not significantly affect playing.

What if I lose or break an aligner? Contact the practice. Depending on where you are in your treatment, you may be advised to move to the next aligner, go back to the previous aligner, or have a replacement fabricated. Do not simply skip an aligner.

Can I whiten my teeth during Invisalign treatment? Teeth whitening is typically recommended after Invisalign treatment is complete and any attachments have been removed. Whitening during treatment

can result in uneven colour, as the areas under attachments are not exposed to the whitening agent.

****Will I need to wear retainers forever?**** Retention is long-term. Most orthodontists recommend wearing retainers nightly for the long term — potentially indefinitely — to maintain the result. Without retention, teeth have a natural tendency to shift over time.
